To Show Lincoln Picture in Malin

"Abraham Lincoln," the picture which has been the sensation of the movie world, is announced this week as a First National picture, to be shown at the Broadway Theatre Saturday and Sunday.

"Abraham Lincoln" was more than two years in the making, and at times as many as 3,500 people appear in the cast. It deals with the life of Lincoln from his birth, through his boyhood, the presidency and the strife of the Civil War, depicts the surrender of Lee and shows life in Washington after the war and finally his assassination.

The production has been hailed as an artistic and dramatic sensation by the national press and is generally conceded to be one of the most important pictures ever brought to the screen.

First National's decision to distribute "Abraham Lincoln" is in keeping with its policy to handle productions of only the highest grade, according to Richard Rowland, production manager.

George Billings, considered to be a perfect likeness to the famous national hero, plays the title role, and Ruth Clifford is seen as Anne Rutledge. Neil Craig is Mrs. Lincoln. These are the principal figures in the remarkably fine cast.

McTigue Risking Title In Fight With Berlenbach

NEW YORK, May 28.—(A.P.)—The elusive Mike McTigue is expected to change his style of battle tomorrow night when he risks his light heavyweight title in a 15-round bout at the Yankee stadium with the hard hitting Paul Berlenbach.

Mike must abandon the defensive tactics that have characterized his no-decision bouts, and exchange blows with his challenger, "the knockout king," in the opinion of critics, or he will lose his crown on a decision. There is a strong belief that Berlenbach will render a decision unnecessary, but McTigue's friends say he can punch hard when his ire is aroused.

Truck Competition No Real Menace To Railways, Is View

CHICAGO, May 28. (A.P.)—Secretary of Agriculture W. M. Jardine told the mid-west transport conference here today that there is "no basis for the fear that motor truck is going to compete seriously with the railroads, but that the motor vehicle will find its place in the whole scheme of transportation, naturally and inevitably as have all the earlier 'new users' of the highway." The truck has found its place in the short haul, he said, "and it is not invading over any business that the railroads can do as well or better. The truck is not invading the long haul field."

File Petitions Against Bus And Tobacco Taxes

SALEM, Ore., May 28.—With almost 30,000 signatures attached, completed petitions invoking the referendum on the bus bill of the 1925 legislature, were filed late yesterday with Secretary of State Koser. It was stated that 19,832 of the names had been certified. Only 9009 are required.

Completed petitions for the referendum of the tobacco tax were filed Monday. The bus bill and the tobacco tax bill were among the measures to become effective tomorrow. They are now held up until after the general election in 1926.

Woman Fails In Suicide Attempt

PORTLAND, May 28.—Mrs. Thelma Sirov is at St. Vincent's hospital here recovering from wounds in her side reported to have been inflicted by herself with a .32 calibre revolver at Dundee, Ore., Tuesday. Physicians reported today she was in no danger but could not say how long she would be at the hospital.

Reports from Newberg said she was found in a clump of brush near the railroad tracks, and that she had fired the shots with suicidal intent, owing to despondency owing to domestic troubles.

Mrs. Sirov was employed here for a short time, doing newspaper work and later selling seedlings. She came here from Wyoming.

Lakeview To Get Another Sawmill

(Special to The Herald)

LAKEVIEW, May 28.—Construction of a new saw mill seven miles north of Lakeview by J. A. Edmises, one of the pioneer lumbermen of Lake county and formerly identified with the pine lumber industry in the southern pine belt, was announced here this morning.

The plant will be small, of 10,000 capacity per eight hour shift, and will be completed by the middle of next month.

By buying up small holdings and blocking up during the past few months, Mr. Edmises has acquired sufficient timber to run the mill for three years. He is planning to double the capacity next year.

N. C. O. Hopes To Begin New Work In Sixty Days

(Special to The Herald)

LAKEVIEW, May 28.—Construction on the standardization of the N. C. & O. from Lakeview south to Wendell, Calif., will start within sixty days, was the prediction today of S. H. McCarthy, general manager of the narrow gauge line.

Mr. McCarthy, while reluctant to answer direct questions concerning the future policy of the road, said that in his opinion the interstate commerce commission would come to some decision on the petition for standardization within the next 60 days.

The railroad man denied all rumors that material had all ready been assembled for construction work on the project.

Girl On Midnight Party Dies In Try To Aid Companion

EVERETT, Wash., May 28.—Eliza Pike, 16, junior student in the high school at Arlington and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. M. H. Pike of Arlington, was fatally injured early this morning when she slipped and fell over a high embankment at the end of a paved highway outside Arlington.

The young girl, with a friend, Gladys Bovin, had been on an auto ride with two young men. The party is said to have stopped at the end of the pavement where the Bovin girl left the car. Immediately she plunged over the embankment. Searching for her the Pike girl turned the spot light over the bank and saw her 150 feet below uninjured, but in doing so she slipped and fell over herself, fracturing her skull on a rock. Several hours later the party reported the accident to the authorities at Arlington who held the boys until the accident had been investigated.

The names of the young men were not given out. Miss Pike was dead when her body was found at about 1:30 o'clock this morning.
