McKenzies Pass Soon Open to Automobiles

BEND, May 29.—The McKenzies Pass will be opened for automobiles within two weeks, in the opinion of A. D. Abbott, local agent of the Standard Oil company, who was at the summit yesterday.

Thirty feet of snow in the cut is being dynamited by three men of the bureau of public roads today and posts of the American Legion in central Oregon and the Willamette valley plan to unite Sunday, May 31, in a concentrated effort to open the road over the summit. Mr. Abbott says that when the 30 foot bank is broken up the snow will melt sufficiently that cars will be able to cross within two weeks at least.

The first car into East Lake this year was driven in yesterday by A. D. Tiller of Bend. The day before he had visited the Lake but walked in four miles. Fishing is good at the Lake now and Mr. and Mrs. Tiller got the full limit white in yesterday.

French Worried By Heavy Loss In Riffian War

PARIS, May 29.—An accord regarding the French policy in Morocco was reached today by the government and the socialist bloc of the chamber of deputies when the government adopted the socialist order of the day for today's chamber consideration of the Moroccan question. This agreement formally averted the previously threatened political crisis.

Meanwhile Adb-El-Krim, according to the latest of advices is continuing his strenuous efforts at reinforcement and is losing no opportunity of attacking the French. The fighting, while on a small scale, is continuous and costly.

Military experts point out that the proportion of killed or wounded to the number of troops engaged works out at about the same ratio as in the World war. Many of the French losses are due to the expert sniping of the Riffians, who are equipped with the best rifles and know how to use them.

Revolution In Albania Near

BELGRADE, Jugo Slavia, May 29.—(A. P.)—Trouble again, is brewing in southern Albania, say dispatches from Tirana, the capital. Insurgents gradually are forming from the posts, and attacking the regular forces, it is asserted, and the capital itself is in danger.

Premier Ashmed Zoga's authority, the dispatches say, seemed badly shaken in the region where the movement is proceeding. He has returned to the capital from Durazzo and is preparing for operations on a large scale.

The insurgent leader is said to be Kemal Beg Vrioni, who is in touch with the members of the former regime, now outside the country. He is understood to have the support of Bulgarian and Macedonian organizations in Vienna.

LANGELL VALLEY, May 29.—Do you remember the barbecue held in Langel Valley last year—a barbecue to celebrate the turning of the water into the west side canal? Those who were fortunate enough to be there will remember it for many a day, as it was one of the greatest celebrations ever held by any of the outside communities of the country.
