COMING FIGHT DRAWS INTEREST; GORMAN IS BACKED BY LOGGERS

Greater outside interest in the boxing card to be staged Tuesday night, June 2, is being manifested than at any fight held here this year.

Reservations have been received from nearly every logging camp in the district. A block of ten ring-side seats has been ordered by Jimmy Howers of Ashland, ardent fight fan and promoter, who will bring with him Jud Miller, Shy Pearson, Johnny Enders and others.

NEW YORK, May 29.—(A.P.)—Mike McTigue will go into the ring at the Yankee stadium at 10 o'clock tonight to defend his world's light-heavyweight crown against Paul Berlenbach, knockout king.

Berlenbach is a favorite with many, but assurances by the champion that he is in excellent trim and that his right hand is working to order, have given some fans a different view of the battle.

These figures that McTigue will outsmart the challenger after Paul has punched himself out. McTigue has been much criticized since the won the title for purely defensive tactics in no-decision fights. There will be a decision tonight.

Berlenbach is confident of winning by a knockout and intends to draw McTigue from his defensive shell and force him to swap blows during the 15 rounds.
