It is expected to hold memorial services June 7, but definite plans have not been arranged.

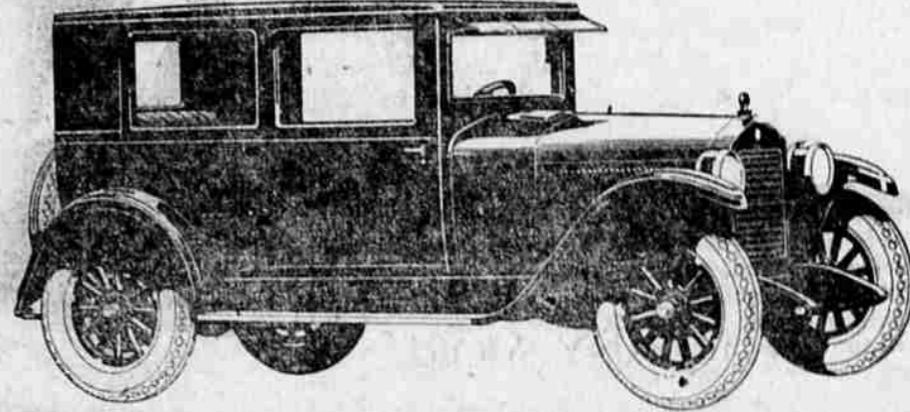
AT THE LIBERTY
