FLORIDA TO SMOOTH PATH OF PROSPECTIVE CITIZENS TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP)-The simple filing of an affidavit certifying a desire to become a citizen of Florida, and the maintenance of residence in the state for a year, automatically would enroll any person not an alien as a citizen of the state under the provisions of a bill now before the state legislature.

The purpose of the measure, it was said, is to make it easy for eligible persons to take up citizenship in the state. Any person formerly a citizen of any other state is eligible.
