CHICAGO FINDS NEW WAY TO MAKE BETTER SMOKE

CHICAGO, (AP)—A long horizontal gas burner playing a stream of fire into a pile of hardwood sawdust creates the smoke for curing hams and bacon in Chicago's packing plants. At one time wood fires were smudged to produce great quantities of smoke which came in direct contact with the meat, but this system has been discarded.

Under the present method the hardwood sawdust becomes pulverized and smolders and produces what is said to be a superior smoke for meat packing purposes. Another of the refinements is that the temperature of the meat is brought up to the proper point before the smoking process begins. This is accomplished by allowing the gas to burn a short time before the sawdust is added.

The first twelve rows of seats on either side were reserved for the graduates and other students of the various schools who took part in the program. On the stage, which was decorated in palm and ferns, with a large basket of gladiolus in pastel shades, were Rev. T. D. Yarnes, Mrs. T. B. Thatcher and Superintendent J. P. Wells. Relatives and friends of the graduates filled the theater to capacity.

Rev. T. D. Yarnes, pastor of the Grace Methodist church, delivered the invocation. Mrs. Theresa B. Thatcher gave the address and chose as her subject "What Are You Going to Do Tomorrow, and Why?" Laying stress upon the importance of integrity in the young person's life, Mrs. Thatcher spoke of the self management in morals, habits, the care and use of money saving and various other habits which are formed in young life.

"Find your right work, make your decision early in life, make the most of your strong points and above all begin life's program cheerfully," said Mrs. Thatcher.

"Too much stress cannot be laid upon the choosing of one's life mate and you cannot take too much time in finding what kind of people you are courting," she said. "No better moral could be followed by any young boy or girl than that verse from Shakespeare, 'To thine own self be true and it must follow as the night the day, thou canst not then be false to any man.'"
