Robber Suspect Held In Portland

**Man Wounded in Both Arms is Picked Up By Police Early Today**

PORTLAND, Ore., June 6.—Frank Clark, about 25, wounded in both arms, was being held today by local police for Seattle authorities in connection with the holdup and robbery of the State Bank of Bothell, ten miles north of Seattle, yesterday. Clark, police said, appeared at the police station early this morning asking medical attention. He said he arrived in Portland from Eugene, Ore., and had been held up and shot in the Albuca railroad yards here.

Officers at Vancouver, Wash., near here, were today holding another suspect in connection with the Bothell bank robbery. City police at Vancouver last night picked him up in an automobile, which he was driving. He gave his name as George Leonard, aged 22. There was blood on Leonard's clothing, officers said. He was turned over by the police to Sheriff William Thompson, who planned to question him today.

Chiloquin Baby Clinic Will Be Held On June 10

The Woman's Community club and the Parent-Teachers' association of Chiloquin are fostering a "Well Baby and Pre-School Clinic," to be held at the Chiloquin school building on Wednesday June 10. These ladies, vitally interested in the promotion of public health, have asked Dr. Newsom, county health officer to conduct their clinic.

Dr. Newsom and Dr. Rogers, physician on the Indian reservation, will conduct the physical examination. They will be assisted by Mrs. Lulu Johnson, public health nurse, of the Indian reservation, and Miss Lydia Fricke, county health nurse.

The ladies of Chiloquin have organized their clubs within the last year. They are interested in the promotion of community activities, civic affairs and in the promotion of public health.

The health of these babies and pre-school children is one of their first considerations. All mothers living in the Chiloquin community are urged to bring their babies and pre-school children to this clinic for physical examination and advice as to the care of their children.

CHICAGO, June 6.—(A.P.)—The tombstone over his father's grave in Waukegan cemetery, which fell when he attempted to climb it, resulted in the death today of Lester Lachic, five years old.
