Baseball Twirler Held For Assault

PHILADELPHIA, June 10.—(A.P.)—Eddie Rommel, star pitcher of the Philadelphia Athletics, was held in \$800 bail for court today on a charge of assault and battery as the result of a free for all fight at Shibe park Monday night during a boxing show. Cy Perkins and "Mickey" Cochrane, catchers, and Ira Thomas, coach, also accused, were discharged by the police magistrate who heard the case.

The prosecutor was Arthur Goodleman, one of four brothers attending the boxing show. The brothers had seats near the ball players and during the semi-windup there was considerable bantering. Rommel was accused of hitting Arthur Goodleman, who displayed a damaged face.

The rumpus is alleged to have started when Rommel made a disparaging remark about one of the boxers favored by the Goodleman brothers.

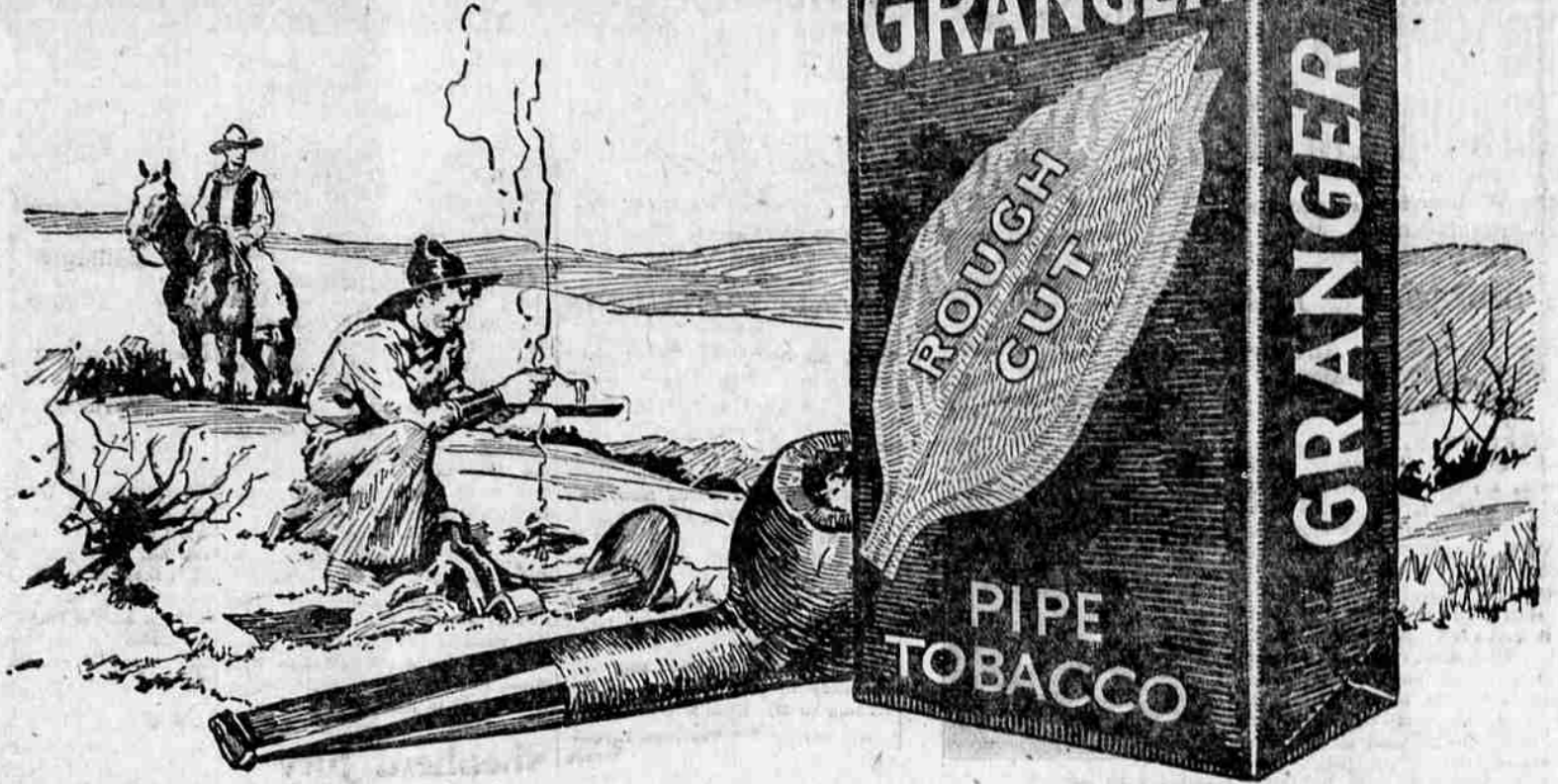
