In keeping with the general policy of the Klamath Ice and Storage company of giving the public the highest efficiency in quality and service, no expense has been spared to provide the new quarters with every possible convenience for sanitary manufacture. The building is constructed of concrete tile with concrete floors and steel sash windows. It is so drained that floors and working parts can be thoroughly hosed and cleaned daily. One feature of the machinery equipment is the big Miller washer which automatically runs each empty bottle through several solutions of citrus soda at a temperature of one hundred and twenty degrees before being gradually cooled with a number of rinses. The best line of national standard drinks from Coco Cola to Hires Root Beer are put out by this organization whose aim is quality regardless of cost. In order to meet the demand of increasing business and to insure prompt service to the outlying districts, a new ton truck has been purchased this spring.
