JIMMY COTRELL IS KNOCKED OUT

PENDLETON, June 13. —George McCormick of Mullan, Idaho, knocked out Jimmy Cottrell of Spokane, in the ninth round of a scheduled ten round main event of a card held here last night. The knockout came at the close of the first minute of the round and was really the result of a knockdown in the sixth when the bell saved Cottrell. The Spokane welterweight fought thru the seventh and eighth in an apparent trance and hung on to save himself. It was the first time Cottrell had ever been knocked out. In the second round Cottrell broke his hand and was handicapped during the rest of the night, although up to the sixth he had a slight edge over McCormick. The men are among the best known welterweights in the northwest.

Past dry years have caused a great reduction in herds and now when there is so much grass it seems too bad that there is not enough stock to take advantage of it."
