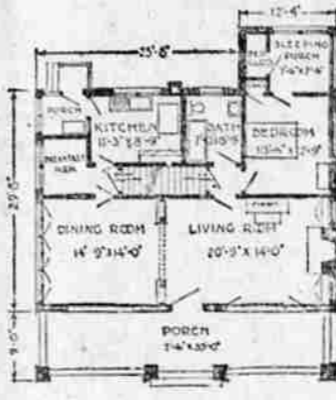
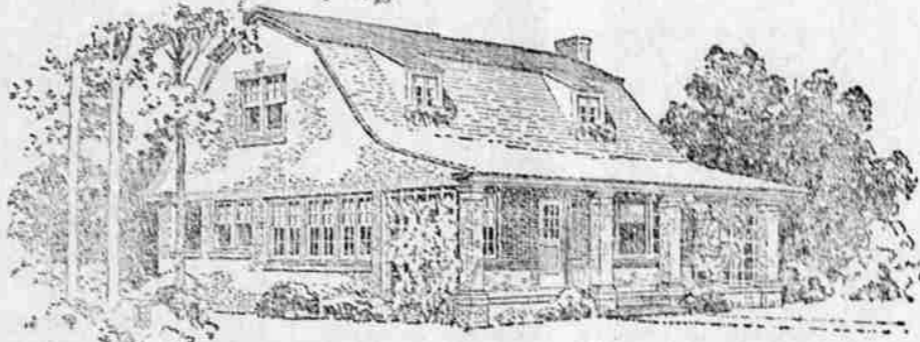

To the lover of the Colonial, this design will make a strong appeal. The gambrel roof, always charming, gives additional space in the attic that may be utilized for a billiard room, a play room for the children, or divided into two bedrooms and a bath, thereby gaining more space and greater use at a slight additional cost.

The low sweeping lines of the house adapt it to any location. It would look as well on a narrow city lot as on the farm, on the hillside as well as in the valley, and should appeal to those who wish their home to appear to have grown up with its surroundings. Careful consideration of color and texture of both brick and mortar joint is all that is further required to make it a marked success.

Broad and low, imparting its coolness to the balance of the house, the porch is here the dominant feature. Its wide, easy steps and brick floor give a feeling of hominess.

Extending across the front of the house, the living and dining rooms, separated only

by a colonnade, make one spacious room. Windows and casements give ample light and ventilation. At the end of the living room, and flanked by bookcases, is the fireplace, a real open fireplace, for a log fire on chill October days or throughout the winter.

Connecting the dining room and kitchen is a breakfast room, a cheery little spot just a step from the kitchen. The kitchen, arranged for modern requirements, is small and compact, with a cupboard that takes the place of a pantry. The enclosed rear porch accommodates the refrigerator, keeping the ice man from the kitchen.

The bedroom and bath are isolated from the rest of the house, and the sleeping porch has a door that will accommodate a disappearing bed.

The commodious basement is reached by a stairway from the breakfast room and has laundry, heater and fuel rooms, as well as storage room for vegetables and other winter supplies.

Dance Barge Is Declared Safe By Fire Chief

Because of repeated rumor that the dance barge Venetian on Lake Ewauna was unsafe for dancing, a thorough inspection of the barge was made today by Fire Chief Keith Ambrose which resulted in his giving forth a statement that every safety requirement had been met by proprietors of the barges.

His report sets forth that he has made several investigations, both when the barge was empty and when it was loaded with dancers and that as a result of these inspections he ordered certain changes, such as the provision of additional pontoon, Charles Osboom, local architect, accompanied Chief Ambrose on the inspections.

According to the statement, every change suggested has been complied with by the management and the barge is now absolutely safe.

Calcium Cyanide Proves Worth As Squirrel Killer

Tests of Calcium cyanide conducted yesterday on squirrel colonies on the Geary ranch in Wocus marsh proved its effectiveness as an exterminator, in the opinion of C. A. Henderson, county agent.

Henderson issued a word of warning about the use of the poison.

"Calcium cyanide, when placed in contact with wet earth, liberates a deadly gas," he said.

"Care should be used in handling it. The cans should not be opened in a closed room and care should be taken that none of the liquid is allowed to remain on the clothes. Its power is best demonstrated by the fact that an ounce, placed at the entrance to a squirrel den, liberates sufficient gas to kill any squirrel that enters the hole for a period of 24 hours."

The American Shorthorn Breeders' association has written the fair board offering a cash prize of \$10 for the best Shorthorn bull and a like amount for the best Shorthorn cow. Shorthorns entered in the milking class are not eligible.
