### Many Foreigners Menaced In China By Rival Armies

SHANGHAI, June 15.—(A.P.)—Messages received here today said six hundred foreigners, mostly women and children, residing at the famous missionary at Mount Kiating, overlooking Kiating, were menaced, following outbreaks in Kiating, where the British concession was invaded and the British and Japanese consulates were attacked. Other buildings, including the branch bank of Taiwan, were looted and burned by striking mobs.

A wireless dispatch from Kiating, the Chinese authorities were cooperating in measures for defense of foreigners and have sent one hundred selected troops to Kiating. The wireless added the belief that there is no reason to feel anxiety for the safety of the foreigners.

The mission bodies have made representations to the consulates of the necessity of discussing warcraft of sufficient strength to send landing parties to guard the removal of the Kiating population through Kiating, the gateway to Kiating. Two American destroyers and a British gunboat have arrived at Kiating, supplementing a Japanese gunboat already there.

The situation at Shanghai is unchanged. Telegrams from Hongkong report that dock strikes have spread to that port. Trans-Pacific liners arriving here are experiencing difficulty in loading.

### Commencement At Oregon On Today

EUGENE, Ore., June 15.—Featured by an address by Dr. Joel T. Hildebrand, dean of men and Professor of Chemistry at the University of California, the annual commencement exercises of the University of Oregon were held here today.

A short address to the class, and announcement of gifts to the University was made by Governor Walter M. Pierce. Degrees were conferred by Dean Henry D. Sheldon, head of the school of education of the university.

The commencement program terminated the senior activities for the year. Baccalaureate services were held yesterday. Rev. Frank B. Mathews, of the University Baptist church, Seattle, delivering the baccalaureate sermon.

There were 430 graduates in the senior class this year. Thirty two masters degrees were also conferred.

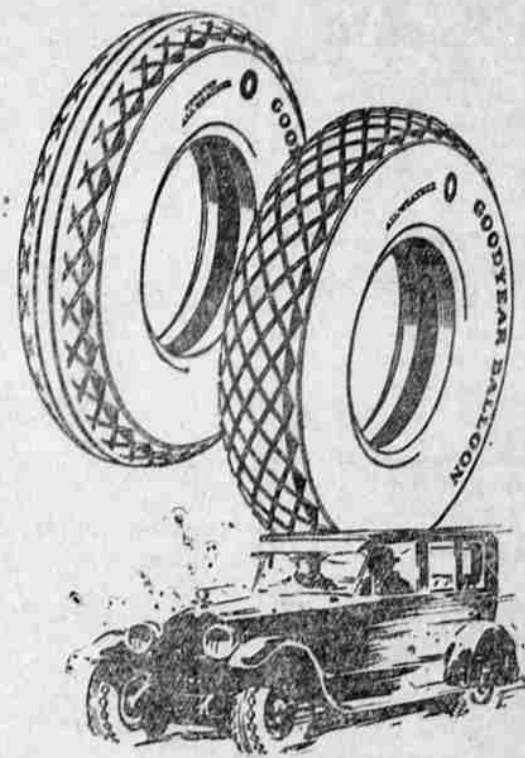
