Street Paving Work to Start

Warren Company Now Doing Preliminary Work

Preliminary work was started today by the Warren Construction company on the paving of the 21 blocks in the paving district bounded by Fourth and Eleventh streets and Oak street and Walnut avenue. William E. Cooper, superintendent of the company, said that machinery and equipment are now being shipped from Portland, and that the work will start in earnest by July 10. 'We intend to remodel our paving plant and keep it in Klamath Falls permanently,' said Mr. Cooper. 'Our plans are to make the Klamath Falls plant one of the largest and best in the state, outside of Portland, as we can foresee continued growth and improvement throughout this section.' Much of the preliminary work on the city paving project is nearing completion, and by July 10 the new plant will be in operation and the company prepared to put on a force of men to rush the job to completion.
