FUME EXPOSITION WILL SEEK TO SHOW SOLIDARITY WITH ITALY
FIUME.—(A.P.)—The first industrial and agricultural exposition since the annexation of Fiume to Italy will be held next August and September. Efforts are being made to give the exposition special significance as being the first serious attempt to develop in a tangible form the feeling of solidarity with Italy among the Fiuman inhabitants.
The commune has announced that no customs duties will be charged on exhibits, and shipping companies operating at this port have granted 50 per cent reduction in freight rates for material sent for the exposition.
