Letter From Secretary of the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce

A letter from R. A. Klein, secretary of the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce has been received by the local chamber of commerce in regards to The Dallas-California highway, which was urged by the local county court and bureau of public roads of the Oregon highway.

Governor F. Richardson of California took no action on the bill which was presented at the last session of the legislature, which results in no link being made in the California highway system for the present. The bill will no doubt be introduced at the next session of the legislature in California, according to Klein's letter.

The road would make a connection between the south end of The Dallas-California highway at the state line near Main to connect at Susanville by way of Lookout, which was proposed as a link in The Dallas-Reno-Los Angeles highway.
