Rodeo Western Nights Will Be Wild And Woolly

Announcement was made today by the Big Rodeo association that by special arrangement all concessions for the Rodeo Night Show and Sawdust Trail, to be held on the nights of July 2, 3 and 4 at the corner of Klamath and Payne alley, would be secured from Samuel Coremen, coast carnival magnate.

His shows are regarded by men familiar with the business as being the best on the coast.

Included in the attractions which he will bring here for the three days will be an Airplane Spin, a Ferris wheel, shows and concessions, and special features for women and children.

All the attractions will be under direct control of the Rodeo management. The show will be run on the order of the Elk's Western nights, with "Bull Coin" as the medium of exchange.

According to Rodeo officials the "19" Camp will also include a dance pavilion and other features.

Among other features will be an old-fashioned bar with a real bartender but with liquor not so real. On the nights of July 3 and 4 special fireworks displays will be set off in Lake Ewauna.

71 Klamath Boys And Girls Have Wonderful Time

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, June 20.—Klamath county has the largest delegation of club members at the boys' and girls junior summer session, having 71 boys and girls. With them are four local leaders and the county leader, Frank Sexton.

From Klamath Falls to Ashland the trip to Corvallis was made in automobiles furnished by the parents of the club members and by the Klamath Falls chamber of commerce. A traffic officer led the procession to insure the travelers with protection. One of the local garages furnished a mechanic and a repair car to go with the caravan.

At Ashland a special train was taken the rest of the way to Corvallis. According to members of the party the president could not have had better service.

The district superintendent of the Southern Pacific who was on the train, took the club members 10 at a time out on the observation plat-

form of the rear coach and gave them a short talk on train signals, guide posts, etc.

The district freight and passenger agent of the Southern Pacific at Medford furnished two large freezers of ice cream during the trip. There was enough so that every one on board got two helpings from each freezer.

Of the 71 Klamath county delegates 21 had never before ridden on a train.

The Klamath delegates are showing up well in the class work at Corvallis. The boys are especially interested in blacksmithing and in poultry classes. Much interest is being shown in the Klamath ball team. On the first evening here they played the pick of all the other county delegates and beat them 6 to 3. Since then the athletic games have been made according to sections, but in the various groups the Klamath boys are the leaders.

The Klamath girls are following their regular program of work. They are looking forward with anticipation to the broad hiking contest which will be held a little later this week. The subjects that the girls are now studying are sewing, baking, meal planning, table setting, dyeing, and home beautification.

Girl Who Killed Sister Tells Of Reason For Deed

PARIS, June 20. —(AP)—Found guilty of killing her sister at the latter's request to put her out of her sufferings from an incurable lung disease, Anna Levasser, Paris dressmaker, today faced the necessity of atoning to the law by undergoing two years imprisonment.

Mlle. Levasser was found guilty and sentenced last night after telling a graphic story on the stand of the death scene.

Her sister, Anais, wracked with pain, besought her to put her out of her misery and her argument finally prevailing they decided together upon the means to be used.

"I sat her in a chair," Anna testified. "She told me 'You will shoot and I will move my head until it is finished.'" The dressmaker with trembling hand was unable to finish the deed with one shot. A second, a third and a fourth followed and "finally Anais' head did not move." Anna said she had planned to shoot herself afterwards but that she was so unnerved that she was unable to put the cartridges in the gun. Then she had decided that she must live to avenge her sister against their landlord, who she said, had ordered them out of their poor lodgings although knowing of Anais' condition.

Funeral services for Mrs. Ramsby were held in Oakland but interment took place in Ashland, where Episcopal grave services were held, Mrs. Ramsby being laid to rest beside the body of her husband, who died some years ago.

A sister, Melissa J. Clinger, 83, came from Dufur, Oregon, to be present at the burial.

Mr. Ramsby, accompanied by a sister, Mrs. S. E. Martin, came with the body from Oakland to Ashland. Mrs. Martin was met at Ashland by her husband and returned by motor immediately to Oakland, where both were called by the serious death of Mr. Martin's father.

Mrs. Charles Martin of Klamath Falls and Mr. and Mrs. H. R. Anderson of Merrill went to Ashland for the services and accompanied Mr. Ramsby on his return here.
