Miss Daw, who is winning new friends by her splendid acting in the First National film, "One Way Street," wears her clothes with a charming air of youth and good taste.

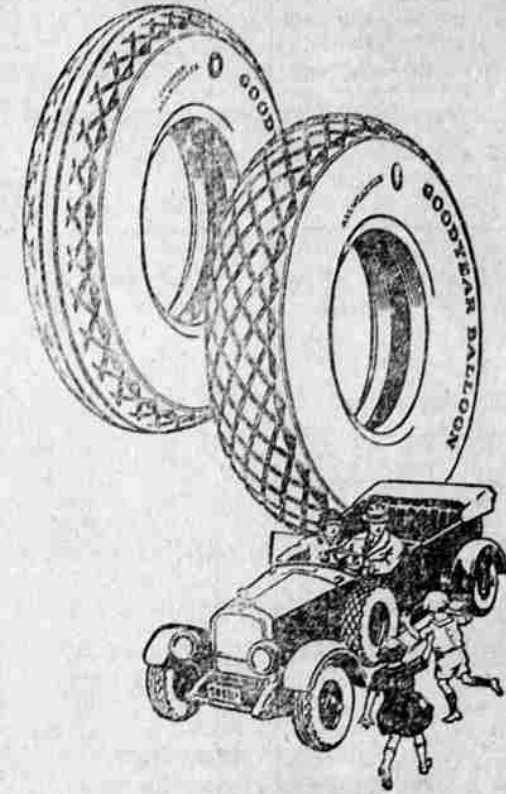

License Rules Changed; Must Show Ownership

All applicants for automobile licenses must prove ownership of the cars for which they seek licenses, after July 1, was announced today by Sheriff Burt Hawkins.

A certificate of title must accompany the application for license, the certificate to be signed by the dealer from whom the car was purchased, or its former owner.

This rule does not apply to cars on which there is no change in ownership, and on which license for the preceding year has been issued to the same person now making application.
