SALEM, Ore., June 23.—The following opinions were handed down by the supreme court today:

Lonie McKenney vs. Lee Warnick, Sheriff of Union county, appellant; appeal from Union county; suit to determine validity of personal property tax lien. Opinion by Justice Brown. Judge J. W. Knowles affirmed.

J. F. Phy, C. J. D. Lack and L. A. Stoop, partners, vs. M. D. Allen, appellant, appeal from Union county; action for collection of broker's commission. Opinion by Justice Bean, Judge J. W. Knowles affirmed.

Fred Lidfors, by Magnus Lidfors, guardian vs. H. A. Pfau, defendant and appellant, and C. H. McLain, defendant; appeal from Multnomah county; action to recover for alleged injury. Opinion by Chief Justice McBride. Judge Robert G. Morrow affirmed.

C. H. Penland, trustee of the bankrupt estate of Grover Despain, appellant, vs. Grover Despain, et al; appeal from Umatilla county; suit to determine ownership of automobile. Opinion by Justice Belt. Judge Gilbert W. Phelps affirmed.

In the matter of the determination of relative rights of claimants to the use of waters of Silvies river and its tributaries, appeal from Harney county; adjudication of water rights; opinion by Justice Belt.

TO STABILIZE WOOL

MELBOURNE, June 23. (AP)—Plans for stabilizing of the Australian wool situation caused by non-sale of nearly 600,000 bales of the 1924-1925 clip were laid before representatives of the wool interests of the country here today by Sir John Higgins, chairman of the Commonwealth Central Wool Committee. Sir John suggested organization of a voluntary control and stabilization company with a capital of \$50,000,000 of which \$25,000,000 would be wool certificates and remainder in shares of one pound sterling each.

TROON, Scotland, June 23. (AP)—Eighty-one golfers here have qualified for the British open championship, among them being the trio from the United States, Joe Kirkwood, MacDonald Smith and Jim Barnes, who returned cards of 153, 154, and 155, respectively, for the 36 holes qualifying play. The championship, 72 holes medal play, will be fought out at Prestwick Thursday and Friday.
