CALIFORNIA MILL ITEMS

Glenblair Redwood Co., Glenblair, has closed down for an indefinite period.

Northern Redwood Lumber Co., Korbel, recently added a fast-feed Yates matcher.

Albion Lumber Co., Albion, has closed camp 2-E and has generally curtailed its logging operations. Madera Sugar Pine Co., Madera, has added a new Yates planer and matcher and a 34-inch band rip saw.

C. S. Nelson, Branscomb, recently started a sawmill to cut oak, madrone and other California hardwoods.

Pioneer Box Co., Shasta City, recently completed the installation of Yates moulding and ripping machinery.

Mendocino Lumber Co., Mendocino, has shut down Boyle's camp. The company has a supply of logs sufficient to keep the mill running until fall.

California Door Co., Diamond Springs, is using three trains to haul logs from its camps at Calador. The company recently received delivery of 20 new flat cars.

A fleet of eight trucks hauls lumber from W. W. Prather Lumber Co., Upper Lake, to Lakeport. Approximately 3,000,000 feet will be hauled to Lakeport in the next few months.

To take care of additional box business, the Weed Lumber Co., Weed, has been working overtime several nights a week in its box department and cutting department of the sash and door factory.

The Pacific Lumber Co., Scotia, will construct a new steel building over its turbine room at mill A, the contract having been let for the steel work to the Eureka Roller Works. Construction will begin about June.

McCloud River Lumber Co., McCloud, is planning to construct a remanufacturing plant 100x250 feet. The company expects to manufacture more lumber this year than during any year in the past...

The Yuba River Lumber Co. has filed articles of incorporation at Marysville, showing the following directorate: James D. Poole, J. A. B. Smith and William F. Mandery. The company is capitalized at \$50,000 to operate a mill at Challenge...

In order to keep three trains continuously busy hauling logs to its new electric mill at Diamond Springs, the California Door Co. has purchased 20 new flatcars and a new donkey. Of the 12 units to be added to the sorting table, six are now complete and work is being rushed on the remainder...

Union Lumber Co., Fort Bragg, is completing a new power-house which will be in service about July 30. The installation, which was made by the Hunt-Mirk company, San Francisco, consists of two 750-horsepower Kidwell watertube boilers. The new equipment is housed in a new boiler-room 100x100 feet. A new fuelhouse 40x100 feet is also being completed...

The Red River Lumber Co., Westwood, recently installed several new Yates woodworking machines, including an electric moulder, electric matcher, double surfacer and 60-inch resaw in the remanufacturing plant. The veneer plant is equipped with a four-drum and an eight-drum sander. New equipment for the Los Angeles factory, which will manufacture doors and special millwork, includes a motor-driven single-end tenoner and a hollow-chisel mortiser.

Redwood Manufacturers' Co., Pittsburg, Cal., is running at 75 per cent capacity, according to W. M. Casey, manager. The plant, which manufactures the stock of the Caspar Lumber Co., at Caspar, as well as doing a general remanufacturing business and planing mill business, is now shipping at the rate of 5,000,000 feet a month and carrying about a normal stock of 45 million feet in the yard. The redwood business, while not as brisk as in some previous years, maintains a pretty steady level of prices. A steady demand for redwood garage doors is reported. "The Redwood Manufacturers' Co. buys a considerable amount of its fir door stock cut to size."
