### Offers Prize To Lettuce Growers In This County

In the belief that this district is destined to take its place as one of the leading lettuce producing sections of the northwest, A. M. Collier, after consultations with County Agent C. A. Henderson, has offered a first prize of \$10 and a second prize of \$5 for the two best exhibits of three heads each shown at the county fair.

There should be some sharp competition for this prize as several veteran farmers have contracted with southern firms for quite an acreage of head lettuce. The results this fall will be of value because nearly every section of the country is represented by a commercial planting and results will show which section grows the most uniform heads and heaviest crop. Fresh greens are always in demand both in the city and throughout the farming section as well as the lumber and logging communities. Most of the head lettuce at this time comes from either the Sacramento valley in local cars which materially increases the cost to the Klamath housewife, or from the Rogue River valley, in ventilated crates uniced and which oftentimes reaches the stores here in wilted or slimy condition.

Among those growers who are planting head lettuce in commercial quantities this year are the Geary Bros., on the Wocus Drainage district, Fred U. Grennon and Caldwell on the Lakeview route, Nitschelm Brothers near Klamath Falls, John Houzik of Mallin, Roy Nelson of Worden, Harry Lythe of Bonanza and Lew Copeland, Jackson and James H. Gordon of Fort Klamath.

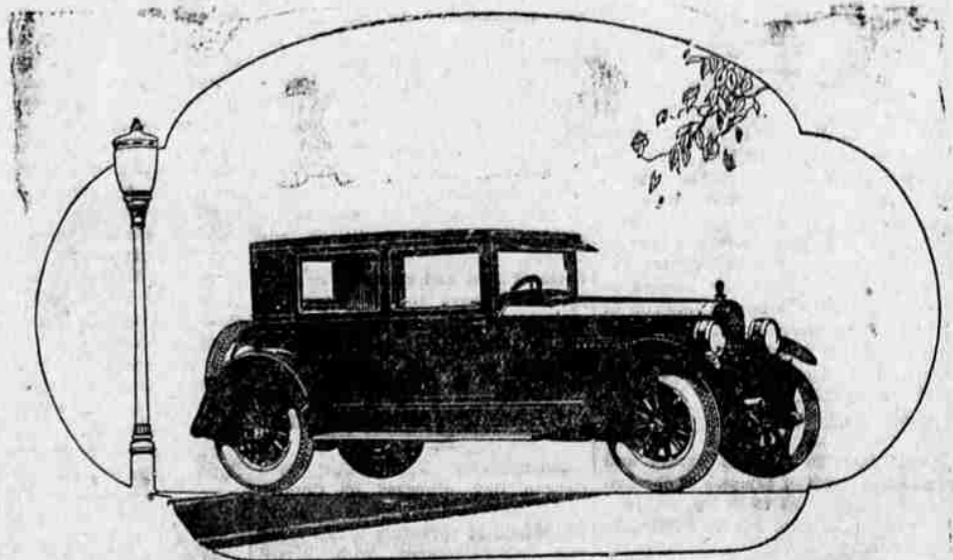
