## RANCHER'S RIDE FOR LIFE TOLD

nearby. He rushed his wife and daughter to a point of safety and then returned to save as many belongings as possible. Most of these he saved by working throughout the night, he reported. Huff said many of his cattle were killed, two ranches above his were wiped out and that the ranger station nearby will be submerged by the rising water. His home, which was in the bed of the suddenly formed reservoir, now is under many feet of water.

Despite the fear that has been expressed that another avalanche will descend upon the valley, tourists

and residents are rushing to the scene of the occurrence and it already has gained fame as a sight of interest.

Ranchers, forest rangers and others who live near the fallen mountain, however, regard the possibilities more serious, declaring that other parts of the mountain have been undermined by seepage from melted snow and that it may give away again because of the looseness of the earth in that place. Earth tremors have been felt twice in the last week.

When the huge reservoir formed by the avalanche has been filled by a lake six to seven miles long, about a mile wide, and nearly 200 feet deep, it is estimated.

Residents of Kelly, Wyo., four miles below the newly formed lake, have vacated the town in favor of higher ground, fearing a temporary stoppage of the flow of the river would be followed by a flood.

## France Plans Debt Payment

PARIS, June 26, (AP)—Minister Calhaux's plans for payment of maturing bonds provide for an increase of six million francs in both the circulation and the bank of France's advances to the state and for the issuance of gold parity bonds exchangeable for the national defense bonds that mature in July and September.

When the national defense bonds are redeemed by the new gold parity bonds the maximum of the state's floating debt will be fixed at the amount existing on the day the bond subscriptions are closed.

The Calhaux bill fixes the circulation of bank notes at 51,000,000,000 francs instead of 45,000,000,000 and the advances to the state by the bank of France at 32,000,000,000 francs instead of 26,000,000,000.

The bill gives the government the right to fix the exact terms of the new gold bond issue by government decree.

The preamble of the bill says the treasury's shortage is partly due to the "continued repayment of national defense."

It says the maturing bonds for which the holders demand payment total 1,800,000,000 francs for July and 3,800,000,000 for September.

The new issue of gold parity bonds will be offered only in exchange for the maturing defense bonds, but the exchange will not be obligatory, the bill says. It is thus hoped to consolidate the greater part of this floating debt.

## Plumbers Take Highway Trip

PORTLAND, Ore., June 26, (AP)—Delegates to the convention of the national association of master plumbers, in session here this week sought relief today from heat and business in a trip over the Columbia river highway. Henry E. Longley, of Wilmington, N. C., was elected president; Albert J. Wilson, San Francisco, vice president; Richard J. Welch, Lowell, Mass., treasurer; and Wilber R. Doshier, Wilmington, N. C., secretary.

Louisville, Ky., was chosen for the convention next year.

## FOREST FIRES AT BEND IMPROVE

BEND, Ore., June 26.—Forest fire conditions were greatly improved this morning, the relative humidity having gone as high as 75 last night and standing at 59 this morning, according to the forestry office. This is higher than it has been in several days.

Nine forest fires have been reported so far as a result of the electric storm yesterday. Seven of these are inside the Deschutes national forest and two are located in the Shevlin-Hixon company holdings adjoining the national forest.

The fire at Charlton Lake almost at the top of the divide was not

clearly visible this morning but it was thought to be about five acres in extent.

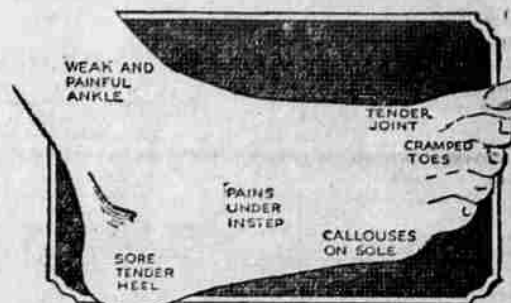
