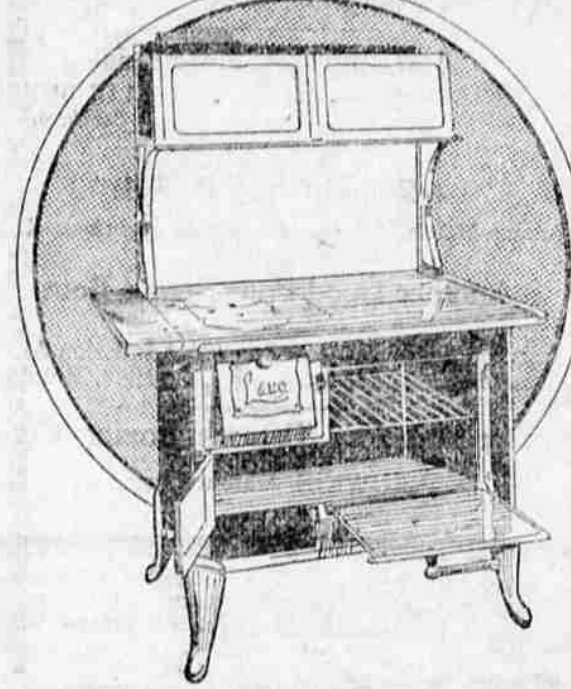

Shothole borers attack only the trees that have been set back by injury enough to form a "Sour sap" condition. On boring into such a tree the insects prepare to feed their young grubs by planting in the tunnel a fungus that will grow only in sour sap conditions. The beetles are attracted to trees in this condition, and attack them. So the first step in O. A. C. experimental control is to find the cause of poor vitality in the tree, and to remove it as much as possible. Seriously infested trees should be cut out and burned.
