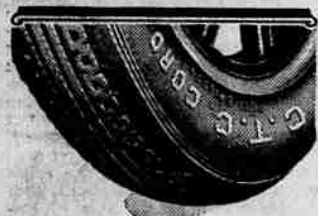

**Lorena Trickey Arrives to Take
Part in Big Rodeo to Be Staged
at Fair Grounds July 2, 3 and 4**



Lorena Trickey, one of the best
known horsewomen of the west,
arrived here last night with a Roman
team and a string of relay horses,
and will compete in these events at
the rodeo to be staged here July
2, 3 and 4.

Miss Trickey has entered competi-
tion in every large roundup in the
world, and has captured many
prizes during the few years she has
taken part in the western shows.

Bonnie Dare has also arrived with
a relay string and these two horse-
women will battle it out in the
women's relay event.

Others who have arrived here to
prepare for the big three-day rodeo
are Sid Steel, with a Roman team;

Bob Gets, with a Roman team; Ray
Murphy, Guy Cash, who won sec-
ond money at Prineville; Jesse
Stahl and Pat McCarthy, both noted
riders.

Word also was received that
George Fletcher, who took second
money at Pendleton two years ago,
is en route here and will arrive by
tomorrow to get ready for the rid-
ing events.

In all, 16 horses arrived last
night for the rodeo events and more
were scheduled to reach here to-
night.

With this array of talent, Big
Rodeo officials, who are staging the
event here, predict that the rodeo
will be by far the best that was
ever staged here.

Permanent Location

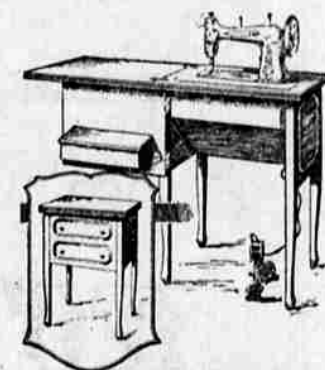
Mr. and Mrs. Percy Burke of
