### Scientists Say Ocean Leakage Cause of Santa Barbara Quake

NEW YORK, June 29. (AP)—Experts were divided today as to the cause of the Santa Barbara earthquake. Ocean leakage, accumulated strain on the earth's crust and extreme hot weather were among the causes assigned.

There was also disagreement as to whether there was any relation between the tremors in Montana and those which laid Santa Barbara in ruins. Some experts said that there was no connection, while others thought that the Montana shocks pulled the trigger that caused a twelve mile disturbance of rock strata under Santa Barbara and vicinity. Dr. Herman L. Fairchild, professor emeritus of Geology at the University of Rochester, N. Y., said that the Montana tremor traveling underground might have touched off stored up strains in southern California. He said that the Montana tremor might also lead to further shocks in the western mountain states in the next few days.

The view that the Montana and California quakes were unrelated is held by Wm. Bowie, chief of the division of geology of the coast and geodetic survey at Washington.

"The earthquake at Santa Barbara is the same old story, an ocean leakage," said Professor T. J. See, of the Mare Island Observatory at San Francisco.

He expressed the belief that the disturbances in Montana had no connection with those in Santa Barbara, and suggested that possibly a recent hot wave in southern California had something to do with the quake there.

Dr. D. G. Townley of Stanford University, said that experts had discovered earth strain three years ago in the Santa Barbara area and had predicted quakes.

These strains, they believed, had been gathering since the San Francisco quake of 1906.

There has been uncounted seismic activity in North America this year, about 25 quakes at various points from Alaska to Mexico having been recorded since January 1 at Fordham University, New York. The Rev. J. S. O'Connor, director of the seismograph, attributed them all to the same general unknown cause.

"Protracted period of seismicity is always followed by a period of activity," he said. "The first quake relieves the strain where it occurs, but increases the strain elsewhere and the process continues until the surface of the earth adjusts itself to all subterranean changes which took place during the period of calm."

WINNIPEG, Man., (AP)—Emily Pinder, a graduate of the experimental farm of Leeds University, is in Winnipeg to begin a year's study of Canadian agricultural methods, with a view to creating, on her return to the British Isles, a movement to western Canada of English farm girls.

"Girls on the farms in all parts of England are intensely interested in Canada. They are seeking an outlet for their energies and would migrate to the dominion in large numbers if only encouraged," Miss Pinder asserted.

Many of these young women, she declared had sufficient funds to start farms of their own and would prove a valuable asset to the development of the western country.
