Seven of the fires are reported under control.

**Chief Mountain Slowly Sliding**

JACKSON, Wyo., July 1.—(AP)—The north end of Chief Mountain is creeping slowly down upon the Gros Ventre River Valley and crumpling as it goes.

Moving down upon the river on a front of several miles at a rate of speed that is almost perceptible, forest rangers and ranchers declare, it will create a great basin if it blocks the canyon, through which the river runs. They believe that the section of the great mountain was jarred loose by the earthquake shocks which were felt here Saturday, and that the result will be an avalanche greater than that which occurred last Tuesday, when a section of Sheep mountain at a point below Chief mountain, fell into the river and caused it to form a lake.

When the expected avalanche occurs it will dam the river to such a height that once the basin is filled the stream will find a new outlet.

Below the Sheep mountain dam the river is dry and all irrigation operations are at a standstill.

The lake formed by last week's avalanche already covers 5,000 acres and the piling up of boulders and earth around the sides of this newly

**Reconstruction Loan Is Sought**

**Santa Barbara Business Men Issue Appeal For Financial Assistance**

SANTA BARBARA, Calif., July 1.—(AP)—Santa Barbara today, through its clearing house association, issued an appeal to the nation for a \$2,000,000 earthquake fund, and to bankers and clearing houses of the country for a \$20,000,000 loan reconstruction fund.

Acceptance of offers of aid from San Francisco and Los Angeles was voted by a representative gathering of the city council, chamber of commerce and clearing house associations. Structural engineers were asked for immediately.

The following telegram was sent to the chambers of commerce of Los Angeles and San Francisco.

"Accept your offer of assistance. Send us today three or five superior structural engineers to act in advisory capacity to city government in an immediate survey for reconstruction of Santa Barbara."

**Through Pullman Service Started**

**Southern Pacific Puts on Sleepers Between Here and San Francisco**

SAN FRANCISCO, July 1.—(AP)—Through Pullman service between San Francisco and Klamath Falls, Ore., without change, was established today by the Southern Pacific company. Up to this date passengers to and from Klamath Falls changed at Weed.

Northbound, the sleeper will be detached from the San Francisco-Portland train at Weed, and will be taken into Klamath Falls by a feeder train. Southbound, the feeder will bring the Pullman to Weed and it will be picked up by the southbound Portland-San Francisco train.

**Bend Hostel Sustains Approximately \$3,000 in Night Blaze**

BEND, Ore., July 1.—Damage to the Pilot Butte inn, famous for traveling men and tourists from many parts of the United States, which caught fire through a short circuit to the cash register in the dining room late yesterday is estimated at between \$2500 and \$3000.

Damage was confined to the dining room buffet, cash register and costly decorations. The famous picture window was not damaged.
