GIANT TREE NAMED FOR SECRETARY JARDINE
LOGAN, Utah, July 3. (AP)—In honor of Secretary of Agriculture William M. Jardine, a giant juniper tree, recently discovered in Logan Canyon near here and declared to be the oldest and largest one of its kind in the world, has been named "Juniper Jardine." The tree has a circumference of about 28 feet and is claimed by local residents to be the oldest living thing with the possible exception of the redwood trees in California.

Secretary Jardine was present at the christening which took place at a reunion of the class of 1904, Utah Agricultural College, of which he is a member.
