mastered the tongue. He did not believe, he said, that the soil in these western districts was sufficient to maintain the present population which depended a good deal on friends and families in America.

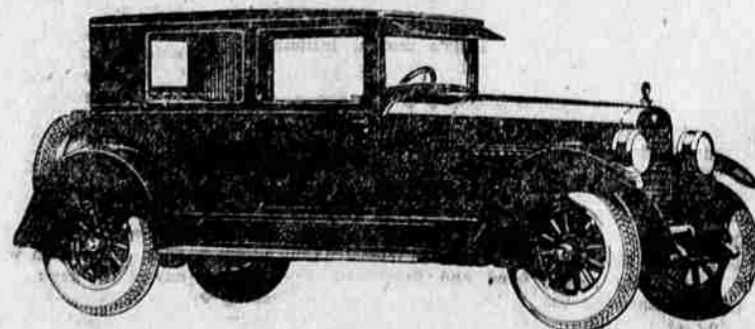

MUSSOLINI GOVERNMENT BUYS VALUABLE HISTORIC DOCUMENT

ROME, (AP)—One of the most interesting historical documents of Italy's struggle to free herself from foreign rulers, has been snatched out of the hands of private collectors and purchased on behalf of the Roman Museum of the "Risorgimento" through the personal intercession of Premier Mussolini.

The document is the protest made July 4, 1894, by the Roman Constituent Assembly "before Italy, before France and before the whole world" against the violent invasion of its headquarters on the Capitol hill. It bears the autographed signatures of nearly all the members of the Assembly from Garibaldi to Mazzini.

Signor Mussolini, hearing that the document was being offered for sale at a large price, ordered that it be purchased immediately.
