Yreka To Vote On Fire Department

(Special to The Herald) YREKA, Calif., July 9.—To provide approximately \$1800 a year for the maintenance of an adequate municipal fire department and for the purchase of necessary fire fighting equipment, a special election will be held in Yreka July 20.

The need for the proper financing of the fire department has been apparent for several months as the time for payment of one of three installments for the fire apparatus purchased last year neared and 900 feet of the 7500 feet of hose owned by the department began to show more and more the ravages of wear. When the matter was brought before the board of city trustees at the first July meeting last week, it was decided to have City Attorney Horace V. Ley draft an ordinance, legalizing the special election. This was done and at a special meeting, the ordinance was unanimously passed.

Under the proposed system of financing the fire department, a tax levy of 20 cents on every \$100 of assessed value will be fixed, creating an annual fund of approximately \$1800, which will be sufficient to pay the balance due on the recently purchased apparatus, \$2500, which will fall due at the rate of a little more than \$1000 a year. By the maintenance of an adequate fire department, business men of Yreka are confident that the premium charged for fire insurance in the business area as well as in the residential districts will be materially reduced by the underwriters and the ultimate saving will be far greater than the increase in taxation. This is exclusive of the actual fire loss that would be incurred if the city had no proper means for checking fires in their incipency.

At the last luncheon of the Lions club, G. G. Steele, James R. Tapscott and Robert H. DeWitt were appointed as a committee to further the campaign for the passage of the ordinance and following an address by Steele before the Yreka Chamber of Commerce last night, that body went on record as endorsing the levy.

PRUSSIA TO GET BUSONI COLLECTION AS GIFT

BERLIN, (AP)—The widow of Ferruccio Busoni has declared her intention of bequeathing to the Prussian State the entire Busoni archive, comprising all letters, autographs, musical scores, pictures and instruments of the late master. A special feature of this gift is a rare collection of original Liszt manuscripts and scores which Busoni collected with the utmost pains in the course of many years.

NEW GRAVITY PENDULUM INVENTED BY PROFESSOR

The pendulum is said to be constructed solely of tungsten, mounted in a special way, and to be practically free from outside influences.
