### Preliminary Work On Paving Project Is Started Today

Preliminary work on the paving of the Crater lake highway from the southern entrance to Crater Lake lodge on the Crater rim, was started this morning when W. D. Miller Construction Co., trucks started hauling rock for the foundation of the crushing and paving plant. The rock is being secured from the Porter Construction company sand and gravel plant at Lobart near Modoc Point.

The Warren Construction company, which has the contract for the project, expect to start in laying the heavy rock for the road base within the next few weeks.

### Only Small Trees Burned In Large Fire On Mountain

Timber loss from the Antelope mountain fire, northeast of Klamath Falls in the Silver Lake country, was practically negligible according to word brought here by Jack Kimball, secretary of the Klamath Forest Protective association. Mr. Kimball made a personal trip to the scene of the blaze to inspect fire control work by rangers of the association.

"The only damage was the potential value in young trees that were burned in the blaze," Mr. Kimball said.

With the humidity reading showing 38 degrees today-eight degrees above the danger mark, association fire fighters are resting easily. No new fires have been reported since the Silver lake blaze.

### Assault Victim Remains Silent; Condition Good

A tight lipped silence on the part of the victim, has prevented the police to ascertain just what facts are connected with the stabbing of Ben H. Hinds in the notorious "Black Pelican" dive early this morning. Hinds is at the Klamath General hospital suffering from three or four gashes inflicted with a knife.

When the police arrived last night, Hinds was unconscious. His assailant was not to be found. From what little could be gleaned by police officers, it appeared that the stabbing arose from an argument about whiskey. Hinds, according to officers, has served time for bootlegging.

"I can't help him out if he won't talk," Chief of Police Loucks said this morning, after trying vainly to obtain the identity of Hinds' assailant. "I tried to get something out of him when he regained consciousness, but his story was so disconnected that I gave up".

According to hospital authorities this morning, Hinds' condition is good and his recovery is assured.

### Small Apartment House Will Rise

Construction will start soon on a new apartment house on Klamath avenue near Link River bridge, it became known today. The new building, which will contain seven two-room apartments, will cost approximately \$10,000. It is being constructed by the Saw Mill Construction company, of which F. Hill Hunter is president. It will be built on the lake front, and extending from the rear of the hotel out into the lake, piles will be driven which will be used to secure logs, dredges and barges, used in the business of the Saw Mill Construction company.

### Lofquist To Pay Wife \$30 Monthly Or Be Sentenced

Provided he will pay his wife, Coralle M. Lofquist, the sum of \$30 a month for her support, sentence against J. V. Lofquist will be suspended, is the ruling of Judge A. L. Leavitt following conviction of Lofquist on a charge of non-support.

Lofquist is released under \$250 bond. Authorities will keep in touch with his part of the agreement and if he fails to pay his wife the stipulated amount each month, he will be halled back into court and sentenced.
