Denver Newsies Will Be Curbed By City Fathers

DENVER, Colo., July 14.—(AP)—The shadow of an official list of "don'ts" hung over the newsboys of Denver today, as the result of the passage last night by the city council of an ordinance prohibiting shouting in selling papers; requiring each youth to obtain a city license and specifying the corner on which he may operate.

The ordinance requires that all newsboys must sell from stands on designated street corners and each stand must offer for sale editions of every Denver daily newspaper. Licenses would be issued without charge.

The ordinance now goes to Mayor Stapleton for signature or veto.

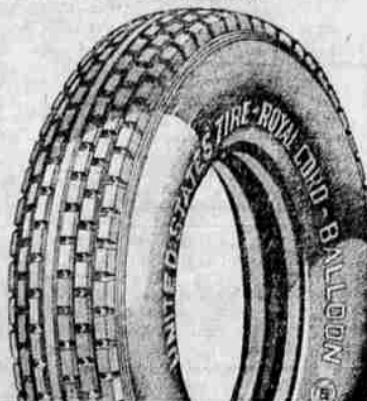
