### Farm Exchange to Be Located in This City

#### Plans Announced and Warehouse Secured by B. T. Axford

With the arrival of B. T. Axford in the city, announcement was made that Klamath Falls will be the headquarters for the Klamath Farm Bureau co-operative exchange to handle all products of the farmer, with the purpose of getting them the best prices on the market and will be known as the purchasing agent, to handle the farmers' every want.

Plans are to hold community meetings in all of the surrounding communities, the first to be held this coming week at Bonanza, when farmers of that community are urged to be present and give their views on all matters of interest to them.

A large warehouse to be used for the storage of products has been secured by the exchange and the office, which Mr. Axford will be in charge of, will be located at the plant.

These organizations have been established all up, and down the coast to aid the farmers and have proven a great aid, being backed by all civic organizations. Up until this time Klamath Falls has never had a paid man in charge, and now that Mr. Axford is here on a salary and having had over 12 years' experience in this line of work, it is expected great results will be realized by the organization.

In talking of the plans of the exchange today Mr. Axford stated that within a short while a market column on the various commodities of the farmer would be printed in the papers daily, with the best market prices. "We want every farmer of this community to feel free to come to our exchange with all their troubles, as well as suggestions for the betterment of the exchange," he said.

The exchange is in no way connected with the farm bureau, an impression which a number of farmers gathered, according to Mr. Axford.

L. F. Russell, G. E. Willman and J. S. Hagonvich all of Portland registered late this afternoon at the Hotel White Pelican.

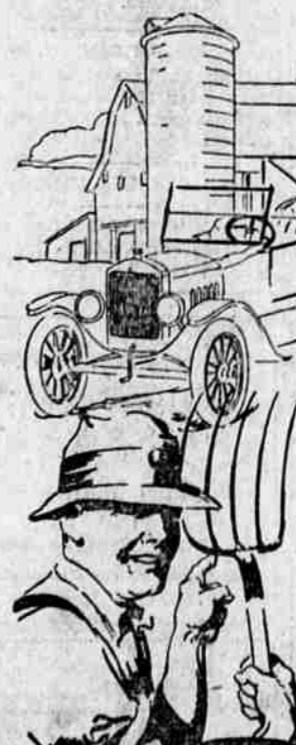
