## EVOLUTION TRIAL SHOWS PROGRESS

COURT ROOM, Dayton, Tenn., July 16.—(AP)—The "broad purpose" of defense counsel of John Thomas Scopes will be to prove that the Bible is a work of religion which must be kept in the field of theology and not allowed to intrude into the scientific field. Dudley Field Malone told the court late today in outlining the course to be pursued in the trial.

"The narrow purpose" of the defense will be to prove Scopes innocent of any violation of the Tennessee anti-evolution teaching statute.

Mr. Malone started speaking immediately after the attorney general had addressed the court for but a moment. The attorney general said that state simply would contend that the defendant was guilty of violating the Tennessee statute prohibiting the teaching of evolution in the public schools of the state.

"The defendant, John T. Scopes, has been indicted for the alleged violation of an act passed by the Tennessee legislature which prohibits the teaching of the evolution theory in all the universities, normal schools and public schools of Tennessee, which may be supported in whole or in part by the public school funds of the state," he said.

Malone then read the first section of the act making it unlawful to teach in state schools "any theory that denies the story of divine creation of man as taught in the Bible, and to teach instead that man descended from a lower order of animals."

After reading the second section, providing a penalty of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 for each violation of the act, he declared that before the prosecution could convict Scopes of a violation of the act, the prosecution must prove first that Scopes taught a theory that denies the story of the divine creation of man as taught in the Bible and, second "that instead and in the place of this theory he taught that man is descended from a lower order of animals."

PORTLAND, Ore., July 16.—(AP)—Drill team contests and a meeting of the grand lodge were the features today of the sixty first annual reunion of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, in session here. Six teams are in the contest, including Boise, Bakerfield, Seattle, Detroit, Jackson and Pasadena. Besides these there will be an exhibition drill by Philadelphia and other visiting teams. The contests, originally set for 10 o'clock this morning were postponed until afternoon so that the grand lodge officers might witness the performance.
