

### Buyers' Week To Be Held Aug. 3-8

PORTLAND, Ore., July 21.—Portland's 13th Annual Buyers' Week, which is the recognized mercantile event of the Pacific Coast, will take place this year during the week of August 3-8. During this week, merchants from the fourteen western states, including British Columbia, Alaska, and the Hawaiian Islands, will gather and be the recipients of a program of entertainment that will be accorded them by more than one hundred and ten jobbers and manufacturers who are the leaders in their lines in the great metropolis of the Pacific Northwest.

Buyers' Week was founded by the Portland Chamber of Commerce

thirteen years ago for the purpose of bringing together the merchants of the various sections of the Coast, to enable them to talk over matters of interest and to see for themselves the varied lines of industries and stocks of goods that have made Portland the famous commercial center.

A feature of this Buyers' Week is the round trip railroad refund made to visiting merchants whose minimum purchases amount to \$500.00 or more, irrespective of the distance the merchant may come from, and who register properly at Buyers' Week Headquarters, which is maintained at the Portland Chamber of Commerce. This commercial event is held annually under the auspices of the Trade and Commerce Department of the Portland Chamber of Commerce.

#### BAKER REPORTS

Fred A. Baker, former superintendent of the Klamath Indian Reservation reported to the chamber of commerce directors this noon what the hopes of the Roseburg chamber of commerce were with respect to the construction of a new road to Diamond lake. The Roseburg chamber hopes to see the construction of a road north of Diamond lake 20 miles long that would connect a forest service road now being built, with a road from Roseburg up the Umpqua river. In this way Diamond lake would be brought 100 miles closer to Portland, Mr. Baker pointed out and the public would be benefited by an enlarged scenic circle.

#### TO ASK COOPERATION

Cooperation of W. D. Miller Construction company and the Dunn & Baker Construction company with Warren Construction company in the donation of rock for the improvement of Oregon avenue and South Sixth street, will be asked of the two contractors by the board of directors of the Klamath chamber of commerce, it was decided this noon at a directors luncheon. The action of the chamber was taken at the suggestion of Councilman E. H. Baistner.

### Dempsey Must Arrange Fight

NEW YORK, July 21. (AP)—Jack Dempsey must appear personally before the New York State Athletic Commission to conclude arrangements for his program leading to a title fight with Harry Wills in 1926. This was the decision of the commission today in refusing to accept Tex Rickard as the champion's proxy.

### Body Of Mexican Comes To Surface

The body of Cecilio Garcia, Mexican, who was drowned Sunday afternoon, was found early this afternoon, according to word received here by the Southern Pacific.

The body came to the surface and was blown to the shore four miles north of Algoma by a heavy wind blowing across the lake.

Deputy Coroner L. A. Towey left this afternoon for Algoma, where he will take charge of the body. No trace of relatives of the dead man has been uncovered.

#### BEND WANTS SPEED

In order to give definite assurance that the Dalles-California highway will be completed by the fall of 1926, the Bend chamber of commerce today asked the board of directors of the Klamath chamber to do all in their power to accelerate the completion of the ten mile grubbing and clearing project between Corral Springs and Crescent.

Klamath has failed in her part, according to the Bend chamber, and should strive to bring all the pressure possible to hurry the job to early completion.

#### NO LEAF HOPPERS

E. M. Bubb Scouts Rumor, Following Investigation by Experts

A report that the leaf hopper, an insect which is the bane of existence to sugar beet farmers, had been destroying beet crops in Klamath county was declared to be false, by E. M. Bubb, cashier of the American National bank at the chamber of commerce forum luncheon this noon.

Mr. Bubb said that experts from the Sacramento Valley sugar company had made a special investigation of local crops and found no foundation to the report.

#### KANSAS PEOPLE

Enroute to California From Extended Tour of North

Mr. and Mrs. Roy Kropf of Eldorado, Kansas, who have been touring through Colorado, Idaho and Wyoming, arrived in the city today, coming across the Blue mountains at Baker. After a short visit at Merrill, where they have relatives, they will leave for California, where the plan to make a tour of the state before returning to their home.

#### SCHOOL BIDS OPENED

No contract was awarded, owing to several alterations in the bids that were submitted.
