New Oaklands To Make Appearance

Garage, local Oakland dealers, has received advance information that the Oakland Motor Car company will announce shortly a new line of Oakland six cylinder cars, featuring smart new bodies by Fisher and many mechanical refinements, including the Harmonic Balancer, an exclusive engineering development.

It has been known for some time that Oakland and General Motors research engineers have been working on a new device known as the Harmonic Balancer, which is said to be an outstanding engineering contribution in producing better engine performance.

The local dealers expect to have full details within a week when the new cars will be displayed for the first time in their showroom.

A revision of prices on all models is contemplated and it is said that the new prices will be from \$70 to \$350 lower.

The Oakland division of General Motors has been steadily forging to the front during the last four years and it is believed that the contemplated increased production due to large anticipated sales during the coming fiscal year is responsible for the bringing down of prices on the new cars, even in the face of the many improvements in bodies and engineering features that are to be made.

Summer Resorts to Be Started

C. F. Stone and Mrs. M. A. Winniford Announce Plans

Klamath Falls district is to have another summer resort, the announcement being made today that the grounds of the private fish hatchery near Chiloquin, about 35 miles from Klamath Falls, taken over by Judge C. F. Stone and Mrs. M. A. Winniford, will be improved, work to start immediately, to make it one of the most picturesque and modern summer resorts in this section.

The grounds take in about 40 acres of land, which will be landscaped, with a number of cottages and a club house to be built. It is possible that next season a golf course may be built, the ground being very suitable for such sport.

The hatchery will be continued and it is the plan of the owners to raise fish for commercial purposes.

Boating and fishing will be encouraged and present plans are to have a number of boats on the waters of the resort. Up to the present no name has been chosen for the resort, but it is possible it may be named "Laughing Waters."

H. Howard of this city has accepted the position as manager of the resort.

Mrs. Winniford left this morning for Eugene, her former home, to close up her business affairs in that city, and will return here the latter part of the week, planning to leave for the resort to oversee a good part of the remodeling.
