and family, residing in Stockton, California, were visitors in Klamath Falls yesterday on their way north, where they plan to visit a number of northern points of interest on their vacation.

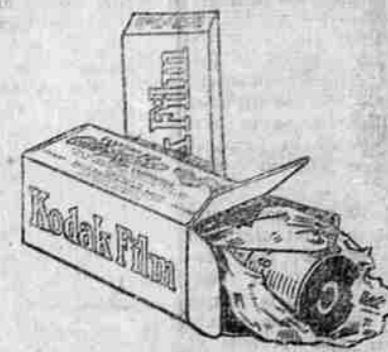
FROM GRANTS PASS

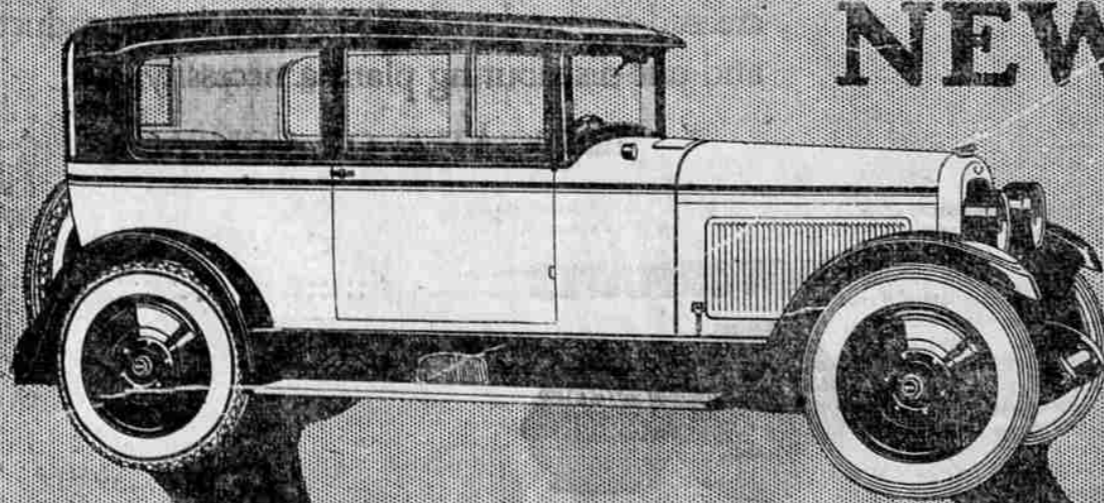
