

Dorris Route Will Be Cut Down 8 Miles

Grading to Be Started on Market Road

Grading of two county roads this summer will mean that Klamath and Dorris will be brought approximately eight miles closer to each other. Instead of the roundabout route by way of Keno and Worden, it will be possible to take a direct line for the northern California town through Midland.

Only the approval of the market road engineer of the proposal for market road construction stands in the way of the grading of the Midland market road, it was announced yesterday from the county engineer's office. As soon as this endorsement can be secured, the job will be pushed to completion this year.

The project calls for the grading from Miller school house to Midland, a distance of 5.7 miles. Cost of the project to the county will be about \$20,000.

In the meantime the gas dredger has been grading the Midland state line road, which will connect with the Midland market road at Midland, and provides the through connection to the state line and on to Dorris. The dredger has completed grading of the state line road from the state line north to a point two and a quarter miles south of Midland.

Both projects will be completed this year. The eventual plan of the county court is to surface the two roads.

Regular travel is now using the new Chiloquin-Williamson river road, which was surfaced last month. By the middle of August the Chiloquin-Agency road will be surfaced, according to the latest report to the county engineer.

JAPAN TO EXTEND ARMY TRAINING TO ALL HIGHER GRADE SCHOOLS

TOKYO—(AP)—The military training of all students in Japan, which is embodied in the proposed national military training system, was commenced recently in the normal schools of the empire. It is planned to extend the system to the students of the middle and other schools of the higher grade next year. The estimated cost of inaugurating the program in the lower and higher grades has been estimated at 6,000,000 yen. It is hoped that the new system will be in operation by 1928.
