County Court Comes to Aid of Contractor

Timely aid of the Klamath county court to a struggling contractor in northern Klamath will probably insure the completion of the grub-

bing and clearing of The Dalles-California highway north of Corral Springs to Crescent, by the middle of August and thus allow the state to let the contract for the grading of the new highway from Corral Springs to the county line.

With the state asking speed, and with various southern Oregon civic organizations demanding speed, the Klamath county court recently made a personal inspection of the project let to the firm of Doty &

Messenger, which included about 10 miles of grubbing and clearing of the highway north from Corral Springs to Crescent.

The situation was found to be somewhat involved, according to reports. Doty had quit the job and Messenger was carrying on alone with a small number of men, in a desperate effort to finish the job as soon as possible. The contractors had run into an exceptionally heavy stand of timber and progress

on the job was decidedly impeded. Now the county court will send up a crew of men to work on the job and have told Messenger that they will guarantee the additional men their pay.

All of which gives assurance that the project will be completed in the near future and will allow the opening of bids for the grading of the last section of The Dalles-California highway in Oregon.

If the program of completion of The Dalles-California highway by the fall of 1925 is to be completed grading of the section of road from Corral Springs to the county line must be consummated this winter, in order that the grade might settle during the winter months and be ready for surfacing in the spring.

The firm of Simmers & Smith, which has the contract for grubbing and clearing of the highway from Crescent north to the county line, a distance of 15.7 miles, will be completed with their projects by the middle of August, it was reported.
