War Department Oils Machinery Of Mobilization

WASHINGTON, July 27.—(AP)—New mobilization plans announced today by the war department call for the assignment of enough reserve officers to inactive units of the regular army so that the full nine division strength of the regulars could be recruited up to war fitting with a minimum of delay in the event of a war emergency.

Orders have been issued to all corps area and branch commanders to work out the tables of reserve officers necessary to bring the present peace strength of the regular army at home—three divisions and six reinforced brigades up to the full nine division strength they would have in war.
