EUGENE, Ore., July 30.—Mark Broom, alleged moonshiner, must forfeit his car to the state of Oregon, according to a decision handed down here late yesterday in the Lane county circuit court by Judge G. F. Skipworth.

Broom is held guilty by the judge of transporting liquor illegally.

Notice of seizure of the car was filed following Broom's arrest on June 1, and Broom answered the notice, seeking to retain the machine.

Break Occurs In Hood River Canal

HOOD RIVER, Ore., July 30.—A break in the main canal of the system of the Hood River Irrigation district has carried a great volume of red silt into Hood River and the stream was muddier yesterday than any old time resident had ever seen it. Fishing in the river below the break, one of the worst in the history of local irrigation, was spoiled for the time. The canal where the cave in occurred was on a precipitous hillside.

Crews of men were rushed to repair the break and it was thought that service in the district, which covers the Oak Grove section, will be restored tomorrow.

Japanese Cabinet Members Walk Out At Fiery Session

TOKYO, July 29. (AP)—Two members of the Japanese cabinet walked out of a meeting today when Premier Kato demanded the resignations of three members. The third member was absent from the meeting, an extraordinary session to consider tax reforms, because of illness.

The prince regent, appraised of the crisis, postponed a planned trip to Nikko.

Shepherd Appeals Estate Decision

CHICAGO, July 30.—(AP)—Filing of appeal from the probate court decision denying probate to the purported will of William Nelson McClintock, "millionaire orphan," was completed today by the placing of records in the circuit court by William Darling Shepherd, beneficiary and executor. Weymouth Kiekland, counsel for Shepherd, said that the case would probably not come up for hearing for possibly near a year.
