**JUDGE LEAVITT NOT TO SIT IN ELLIOTT TRIAL**

Either Judge A. L. Leavitt or Chief Justice McBride will call in a judge to sit in the case of State vs. E. L. Elliott, charged in an indictment returned by the grand jury Wednesday, with malfeasance and negligence in office.

This was the decision handed down yesterday by Judge Leavitt on the affidavit of prejudice filed against him by attorneys for Elliott. No action was taken by the judge

on the motion of the defense to set aside the indictment, on the ground that the outside judge should handle the case in all its particulars.

Inasmuch as tomorrow, the circuit court adjourns for a month, any motions or arguments in connection with the Elliott case must be postponed until the court reconvenes on September 1.

It is thought that the trial will take place some time this fall. As there are a number of criminal cases now set for trial in September, the Elliott case will probably not be disposed of till October.

With Mr. Elliott the district attorney, the question has arisen, who will prosecute the district attorney in case the charge of malfeasance and negligence in office comes to trial. It is assumed that the county court will appoint a local lawyer to act as prosecutor in the case. Lawyers of Elliott hope, however, that the indictment will be set aside on the ground of faulty construction and that the charge will die in a natural death, without coming to trial.
