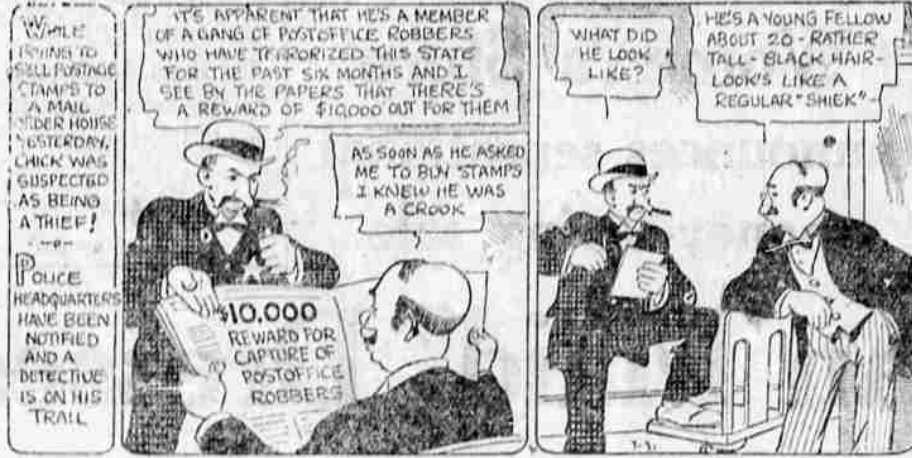

SEEK RECOGNITION

VIENNA.—The recent International Congress of Dentists adopted a resolution asking authorities for official recognition of the professional designation of "dentist." The resolution also urged all countries to give international legal recognition to dentists, so that a dentist of one country would have full legal rights to practice in any other country. Other provisions sought: legal regulation of dental courses of training, governmental guaranteed diplomas and the extension of sick benefit insurance to dentists.

SION, WITHOUT DESTRUCTIVE COMPETITION; AND THE SUPPORT OF KLAMATH FALLS FOR OUR PROGRAM IS ASSUMED.

That paragraph contains the meat in the cocoanut, especially the last part of it, where "the support of Klamath Falls is assumed." By what right is it assumed? Who has made promises to bring into existence this assumption? If it is based upon the will of the people, the Southern Pacific is doomed to disappointment, if it means that this city is to oppose the Northern lines. The Northern lines are wanted by the people and any person, official, organization or corporation that will undertake to stop their coming, must at the same time prepare for the reprisal the people are going to administer.

The Northern lines are wanted, not as a punishment to the Southern Pacific; not because there is any community resentment against it and what it has or may do for the development of the country, but because they are confident that with the coming of the Northern lines will follow the development we have been looking for for twenty years, a development that has been delayed by high freight rates, inadequate car supply and the failure of the Southern Pacific to grasp the opportunity offered in greater railroad expansion, such as it now seeks to offer in an indirect and evasive manner. If the Southern Pacific had built to Lakeview; if it had constructed the Modoc Northern, there would be no need today for the Northern lines, but the Southern Pacific has slept on the job and now must pay the penalty of competition.
