MOORE TRACT BOUGHT

Must Be Dyked

To make it available for yards and shops, it would be necessary for the Southern Pacific company to dyke the property and then fill it in. This would be a big task, as it would mean a fill of from three to five feet or more. Such a move would also necessitate the construction of a trestle from the main line across the lower end of Lake Ewauna, a distance of more than half a mile. With this connection and the filling in completed, it would give the Southern Pacific an ideal location for shops and yards, as it would have a water level stretch over a mile long and ample for all the trackage necessary for the making up of trains, as well as sufficient room left for its shops and round-house.

If this plan is followed it would completely shut out the Oregon Trunk from Lake Ewauna. It might also seriously interfere with the projected crossing of this line across the lower end of Lake Ewauna, as it has announced its intention of locating its depot on the present site of the city park. The Lake Ewauna crossing may be the crux of the battle and no surprise may be felt if one of these days actual construction work may be started by one or the other of the two roads, for it is recognized that the first on the ground will have a big advantage over the other.

Park Big Prize

Because of this move on the part of the Southern Pacific the city park property may become a prize of immense value to one of these roads. The Oregon Trunk wants to acquire the property for a depot site. This the park board is hesitating upon, for all the board wants to do is to sell the Northern line a two hundred foot strip from off the western side of the park. As the park is at the northern end of the property just acquired from Moore, its acquisition by the Southern Pacific would be a desirable plum, as it would extend its property to the end of the Link river bridge and make its site on that side of the river that much more valuable. It will the more effectively shut out the Oregon Trunk from the lake.

In this connection there is a story rife to the effect that the Southern Pacific thought that in the purchase of this property it had the Oregon Trunk effectively shut out from its Riverside street property, believing that the Moore land extended from the lake to the bluff at the lower end of Lake Ewauna. There was, however, a strip of land owned by O. A. Hilliard that the S. P. overlooked and this was purchased by the Oregon Trunk, with the result that it has free sailing the entire distance. It was the second score for the Oregon Trunk, the first being in the purchase of the Eberlein tract.

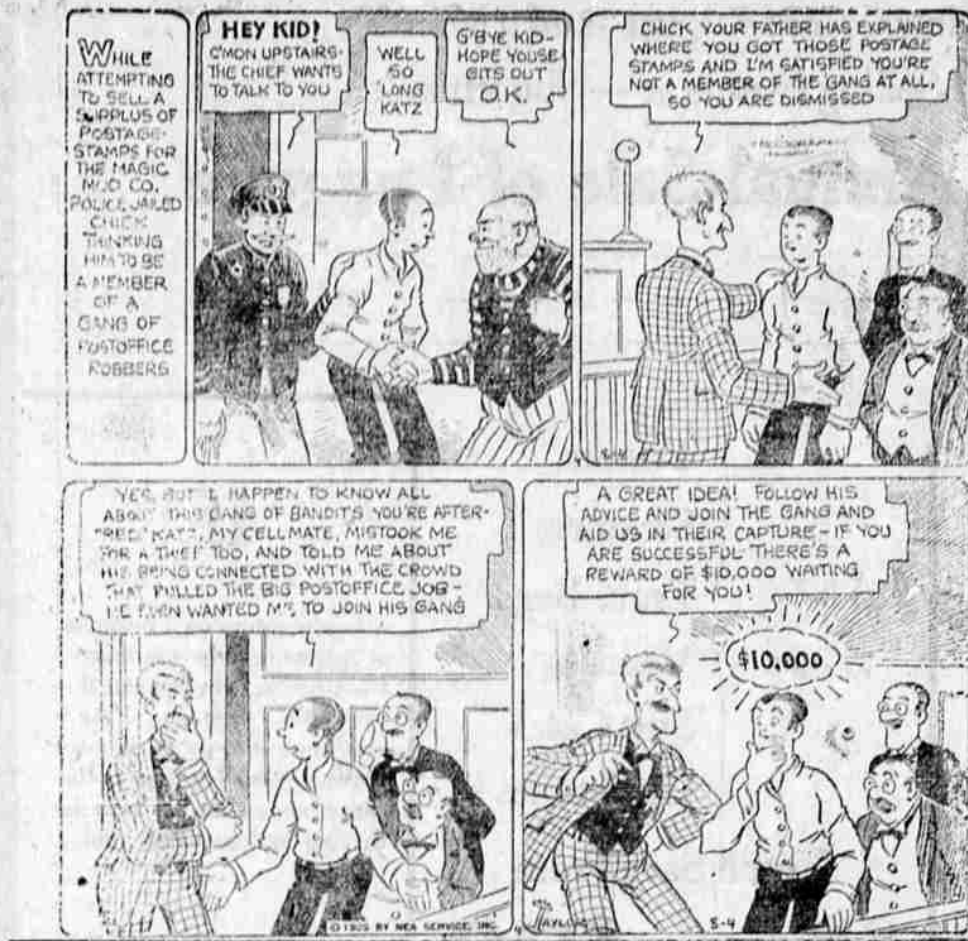
