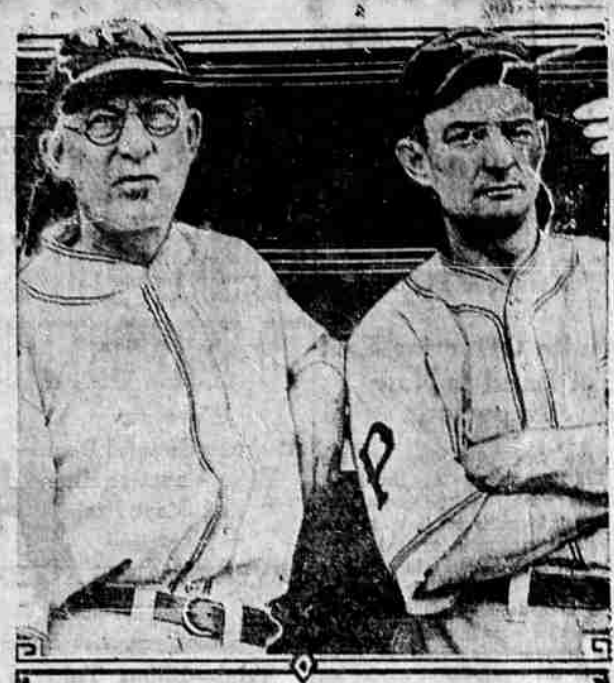
At the PINE TREE

MARAUDING BEAR FINALLY KILLED

Range Rider Slays 300-lb. Animal Which had Been Killing Cattle

BEND, Ore., Aug. 5.—Determined to capture or kill the marauder which had been making serious inroads on young cattle and calves of the Tumalo Beef Breeders' association, Cleon Clark, range rider, with the aid of his horse and dog, succeeded last night in slaying a black bear weighing 300 pounds, and which measured 7 feet from tip to tip, after the animal had been caught in the act of devouring one of the company's calves.

Clark came on the animal just after it had made its kill. He put spurs to his horse, freed the bear, but had no firearms. Clark hung his coat on the tree and started to depart, the bear was wise to this trick and commenced to climb down.

Clark sent his horse off on a gallop for help, then thinking this insufficient or indefinite, attached a note to his dog and sent that animal scampering for home. The dog ran up to the daughter of Tom Merchant, fireman of the Deschutes National forest, delivered his note after which the forestry man saddled up and went to the assistance of Clark. The bear was shot after having been held prisoner in the tree by Clark for several hours.

Woman Fails to Cross Channel

CALAIS, France, Aug. 5. (AP)—The English channel remains unconquered by woman. The icy waters which have numbed so many swimmers, last night halted Mlle. Jane Sion of France, when within one and one-quarter miles of her goal on the English coast. Mlle. Sion was in the water 13 hours 39 minutes. She made a gallant effort and came closer to success than any woman who ever tried to negotiate the 21 treacherous miles of the channel between Cape Gris Nez and Dover.

In addition to establishing a record for immersion by women, she came closer to the English shore than any other of the several women who have tried to France to England.

NEW BRITISH WIRELESS STATION NEEDS HIGH MASTS

RUGBY, Eng., Aug. 5. (AP)—Six times as high as the Nelson monument in Trafalgar square, London, are the 12 masts of the new British government wireless station here, through which its anticipated telephonic communication with the United States as well as wireless communication with all parts of the British Empire will be effected.

There is an electric lift inside each mast to carry four men to the top in 15 minutes. There is also a ladder up which the top of the mast can be reached in half an hour. The masts are supported on porcelain insulators and can rock slightly on a joint at the base. In a high wind the top of the mast sways to the extent of eight feet.

Attempt To Swim Channel Failure

LONDON, Aug. 5. (AP)—Lieutenant Colonel Bernard C. Freyburg, world war hero and holder of the Victoria cross, lost by a scant half mile today in his attempt to swim the English channel.

After battling the treacherous tides for approximately seventeen hours, during which time he was only six hundred yards from the English coast at Point Hope, between Dover and South Foreland, he abandoned the attempt which began at Cape Gris-Nez at 8:35 o'clock last night and was taken aboard his accompanying tug.
