HERO OF UPRISING HONORED IN PAGEANT

CALGARY.—Daniel Davis, 79, a constable of the Royal Northwest Mounted Police 53 years ago, who one-handed escorted 1,100 hostile Indians from Fort Walsh, near the United States border to an Indian reservation at Eagle Hills, Saskatchewan, 130 miles, was on the program of a historic pageant here this summer.

Davis joined the R. N. W. M. P. at Ottawa in 1876 and when the United States rounded up the renegade Canadian Indians he was commissioned to bring the captured to Canada. During the long trek several enemy Indians succumbed to exhaustion, but Davis delivered the band successfully.
