NEW REIGN AT SCHOOL STARTS NEXT SEPTEMBER

Improvement Work on Klamath County High is Finished This Week

JACKSON NEW HEAD Registration Room System to be Installed; Congestion Avoided

When the doors of the Klamath County High school open on September 7 for the beginning of the school year of 1925-26, students will be greeted with a rejuvenated building, a new principal, an athletic director and a revised system of registration rooms.

Several months' work on the high school building has been commencing and repainting practically every school room in the building; construction of an additional class room on the third chemistry class room and store room incurred by the fire of the high school last spring, and construction of a new store room in the basement of the building.

Building Looks New

With structural repairs having been effected last spring and certain changes in doors and windows made to minimize the fire hazard, the high school has taken on a look of newness, hitherto absent.

Any congestion will be avoided this year by the establishment of the registration room system in the school this next year, County School Superintendent Fred Peterson said today. By this plan the seniors and juniors would occupy the assembly hall as their study room, while the freshmen and sophomores would be allotted to class rooms throughout the building for their study rooms. In this way congestion in the assembly hall would be avoided.

New Principal

The students will be greeted by a new principal, Paul T. Jackson of Olympia, Wash., who has succeeded James G. Darling. Also they will be assured of a competent athletic instructor in the person of Dwight French, former University of Oregon athlete, and an experienced man in physical education.

Considerable saving to the high school district resulted from utilizing county prisoners to work on the common labor jobs at the school. All the wood work was cleaned by prisoners preparatory to calcimining.

HOLD YOUTH FOR SLAYING FATHER

Adolph Smetak of Lincoln, Neb., Admits Murder, Police Assert

LINCOLN, Neb., Aug. 5. (AP)—Adolph S. Smetak, 22 year old farmer youth was being held at the Nebraska state penitentiary here today pending probable charges of first degree murder. Smetak, county officers was confessed last night that he had killed his father, John Smetak, 47, and had thrown the body in a well on the farm on which they lived near Wahoo.

The body was found by county officers Tuesday afternoon and placed in a tool house in the Wahoo cemetery awaiting burial. Late last night however, the building was mysteriously fired and the body was burned almost beyond recognition.

The elder Smetak disappeared last March 12 and the son told farmer neighbors that he had gone to Europe. Neighbors and county authorities accepted the explanation temporarily but later began to doubt the story, especially as they said they previously had complaints from the boys father, that he was afraid of his son.

Bids For Bridge Will Open Soon

Reconstruction of the Harpole dam bridge over Lost river will be effected in three units of work and three different kinds of bids will be received by the county court for the work, according to Frank Z. Howard, county road engineer, today.

Bids will be called for the tearing down of the frame bridge and the rebuilding with either the old timber of the bridge, or new lumber if necessity requires; another bid will be for the construction of fills which would connect the road on either side with the new bridge, much shorter than the old one; and a third bid will be called for the construction of concrete abutments.

It is the plan of the county court to have strong abutments constructed in order that a steel span may be installed when the occasion requires.

The old bridge was 280 feet long. The reconstructed structure will be shortened to an 80-foot span.

The Harpole Dam bridge, 20 miles east of Klamath Falls, will be the first to be built. Then will come the Malone Ranch bridge, which crosses Lost river at Langel valley post office. A temporary bridge crosses Lost river at this point to serve until the new span can be erected.

The third and last bridge will be the state line bridge which will cross Lost river at the state line and at the point where the state line road crosses the river.
