

LUMBERMEN SELL OUT TO S. P. RY.

that the Southern Pacific is making to hold the Klamath territory against the coming of the Northern lines."

Simple Bribery

Thus it was a simple case of bribery on the part of the Southern Pacific, bribery accompanied by the big stick. For the past six weeks or two months representatives of the Southern Pacific have been working day in and day out to bring about the signing of this statement. The work has been in the hands of K. C. Ingraham, one of the most polished and astute manipulators in the service of the S. P. The statement signed by the lumbermen speaks for his ability, for it is evidence of the fact that he must be a past master to accomplish such a result.

If it was thought that the production of such a statement from the lumbermen would have the effect of bringing to the support of the Southern Pacific the other interests of the city, those harboring such a hope are doomed to disappointment. Aside from a few of the boot-lickers, it has aroused bitter resentment throughout the city and it will have the effect of stirring into activity those supporters of the Northern lines who have deluded themselves into the belief that there is an absolute certainty of their coming. This move of the Southern Pacific is going to be the spark that will set the community aflame. It is going to result in the reprisal that the Herald predicted some time ago, a reprisal that will be levied against anyone who will join with the Southern Pacific in its effort to keep this city bottled up.

The statement signed by the lumbermen follows:

"We have reviewed with interest the announcement of the Southern Pacific company regarding their plans for development in this vicinity, a copy of which is attached to this statement.

"Having faith and the published assurance that the Southern Pacific company will carry out with quick dispatch these plans if permitted to do so, it is our belief that the plans thus announced by would make Klamath Falls a railroad center, having a direct route to Portland and the north coast via the Kirk and Eugene road, and indirect route to San Francisco, California, via Dunsmuir, and the extensions east to connection via Ogden, giving us the great advantage of a short and direct connection to our markets there—is the railroad development program that would best serve the transportation needs of this community and bring about the fullest and most rapid growth of this region. Their plan affords the most direct route to practically all the markets which properly belong to or could best be served by the Klamath region. It gives the commodities grown or produced in this section—mainly those of agriculture, stock raising and lumber manufacture—the most direct, economical and feasible connection with the large markets which desire our products. There can be no shorter or more feasible route than that offered by the Southern Pacific to Portland and San Francisco, and a direct line east will be of inestimable value in the development of this section. This line will shorten the distance east over two hundred (200) miles and will place Klamath Falls in as fine a position as that enjoyed by any city in the West.

Best Tourist Routes
These connections will provide routes over which tourists would naturally enter our country from the North, South of East, and tourists are desirable visitors who often become permanently identified with a section—either as investors or residents.

"We believe this development to be so important to this section that it should receive our earnest and hearty support. We believe that if permission is granted to immediately construct the plan as outlined that the transportation needs of this community will be fully taken care of and that there will be no need of further railroad development in this region for the present or in the very near future. We figure that the pioneering industry that the development of this country has been undertaken by the Southern Pacific and that large investments have been entered into in order to do this, and that now that development is taking place that the Southern Pacific should be protected and they should be given permission to carry out the extension plans which they have announced, so that they may preserve the values of their early investments. Especially is this true since at the same time it affords necessary and adequate transportation development. If this is done there is a large possibility that the Southern Pacific will be forced to abandon these plans as the expense would not be warranted. It would, in our opinion, be a calamity for this section if the plans announced by the Southern Pacific could not for any reason be carried into effect, and we regard their being carried into effect a matter of great public benefit and necessity in this region, and it is for these reasons that we sign this statement approving their program.

Protective Serum To Be Introduced Here By Dr. Simms

Satisfied that he has now secured a serum that will protect cattle of the Wood River valley against a certain disease characteristic of that country, Dr. B. T. Simms, connected with the faculty of Oregon Agricultural college, will arrive tomorrow and spend several days as the guest of Fort Klamath livestockmen in the upper Klamath Basin country.

Dr. Simms will introduce the serum, in the hope that it will produce the proper protection to dairy cattle. Up to quite recently, no serum had been discovered, but veterinarians in Nevada who were confronted with the same problem, discovered serum which has brought good result in Nevada and which is expected to bring good results here.

Old Document Of Pioneer Klamath Days Filed Today

From the blackness of an old trunk in the attic of a resident of Ashland has come to light an old deed of the State of Oregon to John L. Offield which was signed by Sylvester Penney, governor of Oregon over 37 years ago.

The deed, which was issued in the year 1888 by the state of Oregon, was turned over to Arthur R. Wilson, local abstractor, this morning and for the first time officially filed. The old and dog-eared deed testified to the sale of the state of Oregon for the sum of \$200 of 80 acres of land to Offield. The land was located on the Indian reservation near Chiloquin.

In addition to the small meticulous signature of Governor Penney, was the signature of L. W. McBride, secretary of state, and G. W. Webb, treasurer.
