Warren Construction company has the contract for the paving.

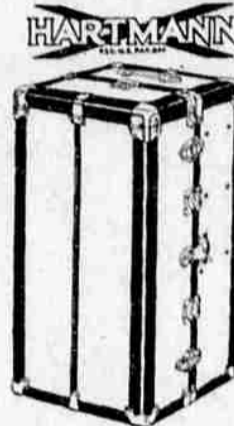
BANK RECORD

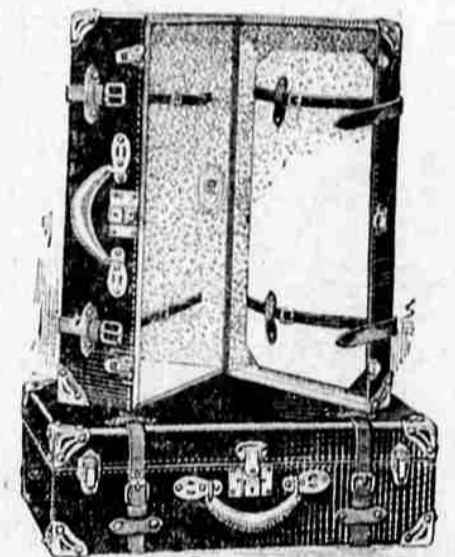
