FRIEDRICHSHAVEN, (AP)—The 25th anniversary of the first Zeppelin flight will be celebrated in this city in August. On his first flight Count Zeppelin succeeded in remaining in the air only 29 minutes. The coming celebration, a number of prominent personalities in the world of economics and science will be invited.

Count Ferdinand von Zeppelin was born at Constance, in Baden, Germany, in 1838. During the American Civil War he served as a volunteer in the Union army. It was while he was in America that he made his first voyage in a balloon. He died in Berlin in 1917.

MANY GIRLS PRESENTED TO HEAD OF TEMPERANCE BODY

EDINBURGH, Aug. 7.—Dr. Anna A. Gordon, of Evanston, Ill., who was re-elected president of the World's Women's Christian Temperance Union, at the twelfth triennial convention here, returned to her home with a varied collection of gifts from sent to her by countries represented at the international temperance council.

In the collection is a shillelah from Ireland, a complete set of specimens of pressed wild flowers of Australia, crystallized fruit and an ostrich fan from Africa, with a history of South Africa and gold mounted miniature temperance banners of Denmark and Finland.

JAPAN PLANS HIGHER RATE OF INTEREST ON SAVINGS

TOKYO, Aug. 7.—The Communications Department reports the aggregate of postal savings in Japan at the end of May amounted to 1,127,857,869 yen and the number of depositors were given as 30,657,510. Compared with the preceding month the deposits showed a decrease of 3,168,474 yen but the depositors increased by 184,932.

At present four per cent interest is paid, but the Communications Department is consulting with the Finance Ministry with a view to raising this rate in the hope of preventing a further decrease in savings.
