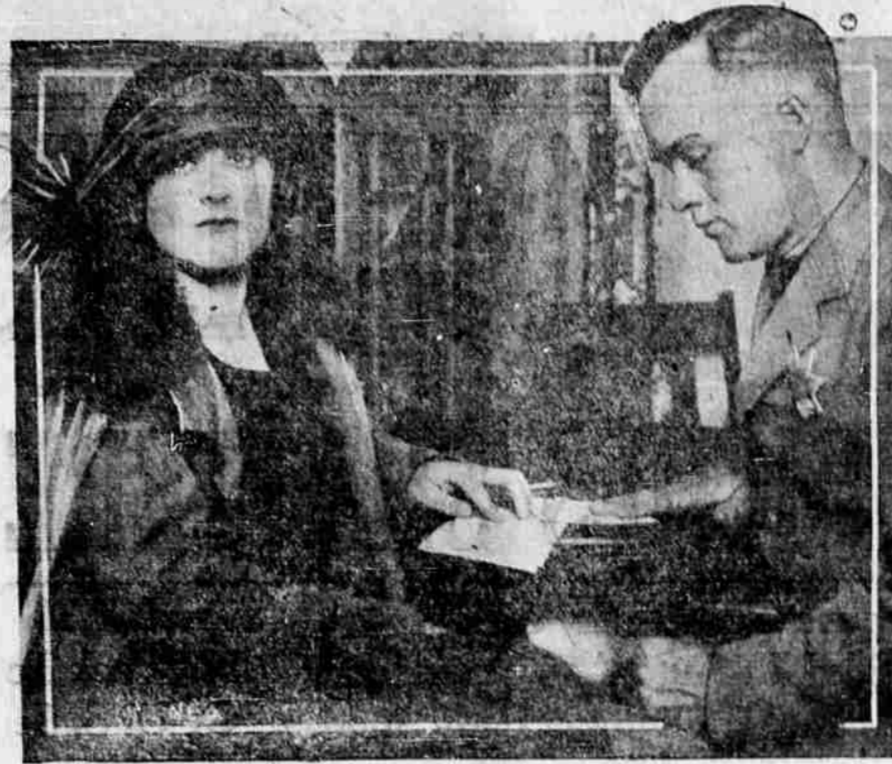

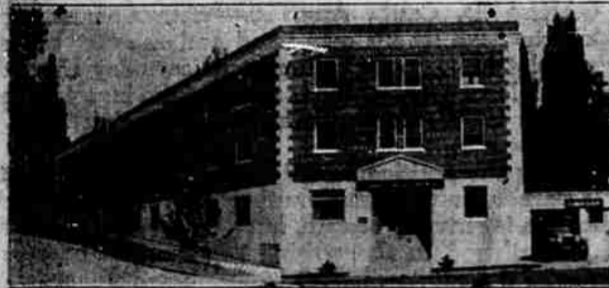

KLAMATH FALLS

Generous Prizes Are Offered For County Fair Race Stunts

The racing program for the County Fair is just off the press and being mailed to interested inquirers who have horses, either running or harness, chariots, automobiles and pony relay strings. Special appropriation by the Board covers a \$500 purse for harness and \$500 purse for automobile racing and it is expected that traffic officers throughout the county and neighboring localities where the roads are good, will have many a merry mile chasing some aspiring automobile driver after the goodly purse!

New rules and regulations have been formulated by Mr. E. M. Hammond, who has special charge of the livestock and racing divisions, and who has worked incessantly to bring better and faster horses to this county, during every county meet.

The schedule of racing is as follows:

FIRST DAY

Thursday, Sept. 3, 1925

1st race, harness race, trot, 3 heats, 2:24—\$200.00.

2nd race, 5-3 mile, free-for-all \$125.00.

3rd race, 1-4 mile free-for-all \$75.00

4th race, 1/2 mile free-for-all \$35.

5th race, pony relay race, best time in 3 days \$100.00.

6th race, automobile race, 3 miles free for all, best time in 3 days \$500.00.

7th race, chariot race, best time in 3 days \$300.00.

SECOND DAY

Friday, Sept. 4, 1925

1st race, harness race, trot 3 heats 2:20, \$300.00.

2nd race 1/2 mile free-for-all \$85.

3rd race, 3-8 mile free-for-all \$80.

4th race, 3-4 mile free-for-all pay on each quarter \$120.00.

5th race 5-8 mile free-for-all \$120.00.

6th race, pony relay race, best time in 3 days \$300.00.

7th race, chariot race, best time in 3 days \$500.00.

8th race, automobile race, best time in 3 days \$500.00.

THIRD DAY

Saturday, Sept. 5, 1925

1st race, harness race, trot 3 heats, 2:18 \$325.00.

2nd race, 1-4 mile free-for-all \$75.

3rd race 3-8 mile free-for-all \$80.

4th race 1/2 mile consolation race \$100.00.

5th race 3-4 mile free-for-all \$120.00.

6th race, pony relay race, best time in 3 days \$300.00.

7th race, chariot race, best time in 3 days \$300.00.

8th race, automobile race, best time in 3 days \$500.00.

Rules and Regulations

In all harness, running and automobile races three or more contestants to start. For running and harness races, chariot, automobile and pony relay races, over-night entries. No entrance or starting fees. A stable-fee of 25c per day will be charged per head on horses. Free hay for stock one day prior to opening and one day after closing of county fair and during the three days of the fair.

Jockeys and harness and automobile racing drivers must wear proper number so sewn or otherwise fastened to their backs that it is plainly visible to judges and spectators. Jockeys must wear proper colors and come on the track mounted, parade their mounts past the

grand and judges' stands before going to post. All disputes and claims arising out of the racing will be settled by the judges and their decisions shall be final on all points.

The Klamath County Fair Board hopes to run all races as programmed, but in order to arrange satisfactory races and proper entrants, reserve the right to change distance and apply handicaps in any race; to declare off any horse, postpone or change the order of any race or event.

Purses will be divided 70, 20 and 10 per cent. Rules of Pacific Coast Jockey Club will govern, so far as practicable. All running races, weight for age. Jockey club scale of weight to be used.

All purses will be paid after 9 p. m. closing day of the fair from the Office of the Klamath County Fair Board, Room D, Court House, Klamath Falls.

FOREST LUMBER COMPANY PLANS ON TWO SHIFTS

Details of Construction Plan and Operation are Made Public Today

BOON FOR CHILOQUIN

Approximately 100 men to be Employed—Movement For New Road Starts

That the mill of the Forest Lumber company at Asprrove may reasonably be expected to be completed within three or four months and that immediately upon its completion it will operate two shifts throughout the winter months was the announcement today of E. T. Horn general superintendent of the company.

The Forest Lumber company purchased the holdings of the Modoc Pine company at Asprrove, about one mile from Chiliquin. Assets of the company included a vast amount of timber and the best millsite in this section. The mill of the Modoc Pine company burned early this spring.

Work to be Rushed

A crew which has been employed in clearing up the debris left by the fire will complete its work by the end of the week, at which time timbers are expected to be here for the beginning of construction on the new mill. About 100 men will be employed in construction work.

The new mill will have a capacity of about 65,000 feet per shift, Mr. Horn said.

Benefits Chiliquin

The announcement today means much to Chiliquin residents. Due to the proximity of the mill to Chiliquin, most of the payroll found its way to that city.

A move was put on foot this week by Mr. Horn to secure the construction of a better road between the mill and Chiliquin. In event that the move is successful the mill company will not put in a commissary and store itself, but will permit its employees to do their buying in Chiliquin.

VIENNA, Aug. 8. — A romance, started when a workmen's council intervened in behalf of the former Austrian princess, Elizabeth Windischgrater, will culminate in her marriage to a social democratic member of the Austrian diet, Herr Petznek. The council saved the princess from being ejected from her ancestral home, the Castle of Schoenbrunn. It was at that time she became acquainted with Herr Petznek, who proved himself a friend and adviser in regard to the upbringing and education of her children. Both of the principals have been divorced.

The princess is the granddaughter of Emperor Franz Joseph and the only daughter of the ill fated Crown Prince Rudolph. Her son is now serving an apprenticeship in an automobile factory and a daughter is attending a girls' high school in Vienna while the princess herself is living in a small flat in the city.
