That the lumber interests in signing a statement supporting the S. P. and opposing the entrance of the Northern lines into the Klamath country, overstepped their rights is the opinion of the federated board late Saturday afternoon when thereupon drafted a resolution and attested their support of any railroad that desires to construct a line into Klamath.

More specifically, members of the board believed that roads that are now in Klamath would never allow the rapid progress that would come to Klamath with competing roads.

County Agent C. A. Henderson, delivered a report of his trip to Owens valley to the board and said that 50 per cent of the farmers who journey from Owens Valley to Klamath will settle here for good.
